Special Assessment Notice No. 55

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that the City Council of the City of Highwood, County of Lake, and State of Illinois, have ordered that Highwood Avenue from the westerly line of Waukegan Avenue, west to the east line of Jefferson Avenue (except between the tracks of the Chicago & Northwestern Railway Company and of the Chicago & Milwaukee Electric Railroad Company) and High Street from its intersection with the paved roadway herein, provided for on Highwood Avenue south to the northerly line of the paved roadway of Michigan Avenue, be graded, drained and paved with a Portland cement concrete pavement, and otherwise improved. The ordinance for the same being on file in the office of the City Clerk of said city, and having applied to the County Court of Lake County for an assessment for the cost of said improvement according to benefits, and an assessment roll, having been made and returned to said court, the final hearing thereon will be had on the 17th day of November, A. D. 1913, or as soon thereafter as the business of the court will permit.

Said assessment is payable in ten (10) installments, with interest at the rate of five (5) per centum on all installments from and after date of issue of first voucher. All persons desiring may file objections in said court before said day, and may appear on the hearing and make their defense.

SPRINGFIELD—The Illinois supreme court has disbarred Charles Alexander, an attorney of Chicago, who, it was charged, under the name of L. C. Mantle, advertised as a clairvoyant and obtained \$300 from Lydia Lemke as a retainer for curing her foster mother, who resided in Wheaton, by means of the absent treatment. Thomas Hall, also a Chicago attorney, was disbarred. He was charged with retaining fees collected from customers of the Chicago Creditors' association while acting as attorney for the association.

CHICAGO—Senator J. H. Lewis is still insisting that his Nelson Morris of Chicago be given a diplomatic position. So far the administration has not looked favorably upon Mr. Morris as diplomatic timber. As the post at Athens has been disposed of, the friends of Herbert Chaffield Taylor are seeking his appointment as minister to Persia. Mr. Taylor's health forbids his accepting a post in a cold or damp climate, and the one at Teheran is said to be perfectly satisfactory to him.
