Putting Trees to Bed.

An interesting method of protecting peach trees from frost during the winter has been practiced for several years at the agricultural experiment station at Canyon, Colo. Early in No vember the earth is removed from a circle about four feet lu diameter round each tree, and water is turned in to saturate the soil. When the ground has become soft the tree is worked back and forth to loosen the roots and is then pushed over on its side. The branches are brought together and fastened with a cord, and burian covered with earth is put over them.

Thus the trees lie sping until spring. when the covering is gradually loosened and finally removed, and they are raised and propped up.-Backy Moun thin News.
