The pupil learns to do when the lace curtains blow down across a lighted gas jet or the Christmas candles; what to do when the chimney catches fire from soot or a defective flue; where to look for possible fire when there is a smell of burning in the house; how to get out of a burning building at night, creeping on the floor below the smoke with blanket tightly wrapped around the body and wet towel over the head and mouth if need be. School drills every month show people how to get out in a hurry in the quickest time and without danger of being trampled.
