ORIGIN OF THE TELEPHONE.

It Sprung From Bell's Efforts to Feach the Deaf to Speak. Professor Alexander Graham Bell is reported to have explained in a lecture how he came to invent the tele-

phone as follows:

"My father invented a symploi by which deaf mutes could converte, and finally I invented an apparatus by which the vibrations of speech could be seen, and it turned out to be a telephone. It occurred to me to make machine that would enable one to bear vibrations. I went to an aurist and he advised me to take the human ear as my model. He supplied me with dead man's ear, and with this ear I experimented, and upon applying the apparatus I found that the dead man's ear wrote down the vibrations.

"I arrived at the conclusion that if could make iron vibrate on man's ear I could make an instrument more delicate which would those vibrations to be heard and up cate piece of steel over an electric magnet I could get a vibration, and Press thus the telephone was complete

MURDER .TRIALS.

Holland Has a System of Its Own For Dispensing Justice.

A learned and capable jurist bas asserted that the French method of legal procedure, which, contrary to our own, presumes an indicted person guilty until be is proved innocent, comes nearer dispensing actual justice than our own

But in Holland the courts have, in some respects, a better system than that of the French. The accused in 47pd every case has the benefit of the doubt. and circumstantial evidence as the only foundation for a plea of copyiction is in disfavor.

The Dutch do not have juries, and there is no buttle of wits among counsel. All questions, whether by the prosecution or the attorney for the acgused, are put to the witness through the judge after he has weighed the justice of the interrogation This feature of their system has

some pronounced advantages over our own. It eliminates the practice of confusing the witness or the accused by misleading, questions. It renders im possible the abominable practice in our courts known as the "browbeating" of witnesses, which unfortunately is permitted to an extent that causes the intelligent observer's blood to boll at times because of its unfairness and eruelty. It makes the solemn business of dispensing justice a common trade instead of a heavenly vocation - Siour

VENUS HOT AND COLD.


companied by a certified check payable One Half the Planet Burns, While the Other Half Always Freezes.

> Venus, the "evening star" of the poets, the most brilliant object in our western sky, that planet which revolves around the sun in a path inside ours, must if inhabited have beings of a very different type from ourselves. for Venus has always had one bemispliere turned toward the sun and one turned away from it. Consequently it is always daytime and summer on one-balf of Venus, always night and winter on the other half.

As Venus is more than 23,000,000 miles pearer the sun than we are. I must be twice as bot on her day si as it ever is at our equator. And on ber night side, where a ray of sun light has never shone, it must be so cold that the air is liquefied, if not solidified. There must be a constant aprush of bot air from the scorched surface and a corresponding inrush of boundary between the two bemispheres this must cause a violent and perhaps almost perpetual rainfall.

Seen through a small telescope of field glass Venus often appears like a William Woodcock, the small son of crescent. Then are visible the projections that can be nothing but mountains of great beight. - New York
