ILLINOIS NEWS NOTES

Miners Scorn Chicago Plea.
PEORIA, ILL. — At the United States Mine Workers' state convention Secretary McDonald read a proposal from Chicago physicians to build union miners' hospitals at several different points in Illinois. It was proposed that these institutions be supported by a tax of 25 cents a month on each union man in the state. The proposition was laid on the table.

The convention voted \$100 to aid ten girls who were thrown out of work through the closing of a laundry in Pana after a union had been organized therein. A plan to move headquarters from Springfield to Peoria will be taken up by the convention this week.

Dr. Cahagan Takes Charge.
ELGIN, ILL. — Dr. H. J. Cahagan has moved into the superintendent's quarters at the Elgin state hospital and at midnight officially became superintendent of the institution.

Dr. Cahagan, an Elgin practitioner, was named by the state board of administration to succeed Dr. Ralph T. Hinton, who left Elgin to become superintendent of the Peoria state hospital. The officers and employees presented Dr. and Mrs. Hinton with a monster loving cup.

Quarantined Co-Eds Flee.
URBANA, ILL. — Miss Genevieve Lusk, of Quincy, Ill., and Miss Helen Collins, of Gilman, of University of Illinois co-eds quarantined in Carborn hall, where a scarlet fever case developed, hurriedly packed their suitcases and fled to their homes, disregarding the orders of the health authorities.

Most of the students who have fled in the fever panic returned. The health authorities think the disease is now well under control.

Chicago High Schools sEst.
URBANA, ILL. — Chicago high schools are more efficient than others in Illinois, said Professor H. A. Hollister, high school visitor of the University of Illinois.

Records of 1,717 matriculating college freshmen showed that 32.2 per cent of Chicago high school "products" "flunked," while the percentage of "flunks" among students from other schools was 35.2 to 45.6.
