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An Ordinance

An Ordinance for a local improvement in the Village of Deerfield, County of Lake, and State of Illinois, providing for the construction of a system of water mains to be laid in the following streets:

A cast iron water pipe of eight (8) inches internal diameter on the north side of Deerfield Avenue from the East Village Limits to a point 600 feet east of the south quarter corner of Section Twenty-nine (29), Township Forty-three (43) North, Range Twelve (12) East of the Third Principal Meridian.

On the west side of Lincoln Avenue from Fair Oaks Avenue to a point 1,500 feet south of Central Avenue. On the north side of Hazel Avenue from Park Avenue to Lincoln Avenue. A cast iron water pipe of 8 inches internal diameter on the east side of Park Avenue from Greenwood Avenue to Hazel Avenue. On the north side of Fair Oaks Avenue from Park Avenue to Lincoln Avenue. On the north side of Ostermann Avenue from Park Avenue to Lincoln Avenue. On the north side of Central Avenue from Park Avenue to Lincoln Avenue. On the north side of Fair Oaks Avenue from Oak Avenue to Grand Avenue. On the westerly side of Grand Avenue from Fair Oaks Avenue to the south end of Grand Avenue together with necessary fittings, tees, crosses, hydrants and valves pertaining thereto, in the Village of DEERFIELD.

Be it Ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Deerfield:

SECTION 1. That a local improvement be made within the limits of the Village of Deerfield, in the County of Lake, and State of Illinois, the nature, character, locality and description of which improvement is as follows: That a cast iron water supply pipe or main, eight (8) inches internal diameter shall be laid in Deerfield Avenue from and connecting with the water main (which has been heretofore provided for in other proceedings) which main is to be laid in Deerfield Avenue from the City of Highland Park to the east line of the Village of Deerfield, at a point 13 feet north of the center line of Deerfield Avenue, at the said east limits of the Village of Deerfield, and from thence the said 8" cast iron water supply pipe shall be laid on a 12 inch tee north and parallel to the center line of Deerfield Avenue, to a point 600 feet east of the west line of the Village of Deerfield; also, that a cast iron water supply pipe or main, 8" internal diameter shall be constructed in Lincoln Avenue, from a point 12 feet north of the center of Fair Oaks Avenue, and thence running southerly along the line 12 feet west of and parallel to the center line of Lincoln Avenue, to a point 1500 feet south of the north line of Central Avenue, and connecting with the 8" supply pipe above provided for in Deerfield Avenue; also that a cast iron water supply pipe or main, 8" internal diameter shall be laid on Hazel Avenue from and connecting to the main hereinbefore provided for in Lincoln Avenue, thence running west 12 feet north and parallel to the center line of Hazel Avenue, to a point 12 feet east of the center line of Park Avenue; also that a cast iron water supply pipe or main of 6" internal diameter shall be laid in Park Avenue, from and connecting with a main hereinbefore provided for in Hazel Avenue, and thence running northerly on a line 12 feet east of and parallel to the center line of Park Avenue to a point on the south line of Greenwood Avenue; also that a water pipe or main of 6" internal diameter shall be laid on a line 12 feet north of and parallel to the center line of Fair Oaks Avenue from and connecting with the main hereinbefore provided for on Park Avenue, and running to and connecting with the main hereinbefore provided for on Lincoln Avenue; also that a cast iron water supply pipe or main of 6" internal diameter shall be laid on a line 12 feet north of and parallel to the center line of Ostermann Avenue, from and connecting to a supply pipe or main hereinbefore provided for in Lincoln Avenue, thence running west to the east line of Park Avenue; also, that a cast iron water supply pipe or main of 6" internal diameter shall be constructed on a line 12 feet north of and parallel to the center line of Central Avenue, from and connecting to a main hereinbefore provided for in Lincoln Avenue, and thence running west to the east line of Park Avenue; also a cast iron water supply pipe or main of 6" internal diameter shall be laid on Fair Oaks Avenue on a line 12 feet North of and parallel to the center line of Fair Oaks Avenue from the 12' feet westerly of the center line of Grand Avenue, and from which point a cast iron water supply pipe or main of 6" internal diameter shall be laid in Grand Avenue on a line 12 feet westerly of and parallel to the center line thereof, and shall continue to the south, across and connecting with the main hereinbefore provided for in Deerfield Avenue, and continuing to the south on a line 12 feet west of and south of the center line of Grand Avenue to the south and east, and again to the south to the south end of Grand Avenue.

CROSSES AND TEES.

That cast iron crosses shall be placed in the line of the cast iron water supply pipe or main herein provided at all points where said pipes connect, and of a size corresponding to the connection to be made and a 6" tee or cross from all mains at each street intersection as shown on village water plat.

PLUGS AND CAPS.

That cast iron plugs or caps shall be placed at the ends of all branches of the crosses or tees herein provided, except the branches of the crosses or tees that are to connect pipe herein provided. Also a cast iron cap or plug shall be placed in the dead ends of the pipe herein provided for.

TEES.

That cast iron tees shall be placed in the line of the cast iron water supply pipe herein provided wherever necessary to lay pipe as herein provided.

That cast iron tees for fire hydrants shall be placed in the line of the cast iron water supply pipe or main, herein provided, with 4" branch, provided with one length of 12" cast iron pipe of 4" internal diameter on Deerfield Avenue.

Tees shall be placed 10 feet west of the EAST VILLAGE LIMITS:

- 600 feet west of the E. Village Limits.
- 1320 feet west of the E. Village Limits.
- 1980 feet west of the E. Village Limits.
- 2640 feet west of the E. Village Limits.
- 3100 feet west of the E. Village Limits.

At the N.W. corner of Lincoln Avenue. At the Section Line S. E. corner Section 29.

406 feet west of said Section Line.

At the northwest corner of Grand Avenue.

At the northwest corner of Second Street.

At a point 600 feet east of the West Village Limits.

On GREENWOOD AVENUE, Tees shall be placed:

- At the S.E. corner of Oak Street.
- At the S.E. corner of Park Avenue.
- On FAIR OAKS AVENUE, Tees shall be placed:
- At the N.E. corner of Oak Avenue.
- At the N.W. corner of Grand Avenue.
- On FAIR OAKS AVENUE, Tees shall be placed:
- At the N.W. corner of Second Avenue.
- At the N.E. corner of Park Avenue.
- At the N.W. corner of Springfield Avenue.
- At the N.W. corner of Lincoln Avenue.
- On LINCOLN AVENUE, Tees shall be placed:
- At a point 450 feet south of Fair Oaks Avenue.
- At the N.W. corner of Hazel Avenue.
- At a point 400 feet south of Hazel Avenue.
- At a point 800 feet south of Hazel Avenue.
- At a point 300 feet south of Deerfield Avenue.
- At the N.W. corner of Ostermann Avenue.
- At the N.W. corner of Central Avenue.
- At a point 500 feet south of Central Avenue.
- At a point 1000 feet south of Central Avenue.
- At a point 1500 feet south of Central Avenue.
- On PARK AVENUE, Tees with 4" branches shall be placed:
- 500 feet south of Fair Oaks Avenue.
- Also at the N.E. corner of Hazel Avenue.
- On GRAND AVENUE, 500 feet south of FAIR OAKS AVENUE.
- At the N.W. corner of Grand Avenue.
- At the N.E. corner of Park Avenue.
- At the N.W. corner of Springfield Avenue.
- On GRAND AVENUE, Tees with 4" branches shall be placed:
- At a point 350 feet S. of Hazel Avenue.
- At the N.W. corner of Division Street.
- At the N.W. corner of Ostermann Avenue.
- At the N.W. corner of Central Avenue.
- At the south end of Grand Avenue.

FIRE HYDRANTS.

There shall be 20 fire hydrants with auxiliary valves and valve boxes, said fire hydrants with auxiliary valves and valve boxes shall be connected with the tee in the east iron supply pipe as hereinbefore provided by a cast iron branch of 4" internal diameter and shall be placed at the following points, to-wit: 10 feet west of the East Village Limits. 1980 feet west of the East Village Limits.

At the Northwest corner of Deerfield Avenue and Lincoln Avenue.

At the Northwest corner of Deerfield Avenue and Grand Avenue.

At a point 600 feet east of the West Village Limits.

At the Northwest corner of Fair Oaks Avenue and Grand Avenue.

A point 450 feet south of Fair Oaks Avenue on Grand Avenue.

At the Southeast corner of Greenwood Avenue and Park Avenue.

At the Northeast corner of Fair Oaks Avenue and Park Avenue.

At the Northwest corner of Lincoln Avenue and Fair Oaks Avenue.

At the Northeast corner of Hazel Avenue and Park Avenue.

At the Northwest corner of Hazel Avenue and Lincoln Avenue.

At the Northwest corner of Lincoln Avenue and Ostermann Avenue.

At the Northwest corner of Lincoln Avenue and Central Avenue.

At a point 1300 feet south of Central Avenue on Lincoln Avenue.

At the N. E. corner of Central Avenue and Park Avenue, also on Ostermann Avenue 900 feet west of Lincoln Avenue.

On Grand Avenue at the Northwest corner of Ostermann Avenue.

On Grand Avenue at the south end of the street.

All of said hydrants shall extend five and one-half feet below the established grade and two and one-half feet above. They shall be equipped with two bronze nozzles of Chicago Standard. Each hydrant shall have an automatic drip for drainage. The drip must close tightly when the hydrants begin to open and must leave no water standing in the standpipe when the hydrant is closed.

The hydrant shall be made of tough, gray, cast iron free from cold shuts, blow holes, flaws, scales and defects of any description, true to form and thickness, of workmanlike finish and shall have a tensile strength of from 27,000 to 31,000 lbs. per square inch and shall in all respects conform to the specifications adopted and designated as Deerfield Standard Specifications.

GATE VALVES AND VALVE BOXES.

Gate valves with valve boxes shall be placed in the line of the pipe herein provided for at all pipe intersections. All gate valves must be of the best quality and be approved by the Board of Local Improvements of the Village of Deerfield, and shall conform in all respects to the specifications known and designated as Deerfield Standard Specifications. All valves shall be made to open by turning to the left.

VALVE BOXES.

Cast iron extension valve boxes shall be furnished and set over each valve. Each box shall have an upright shaft not less than five inches internal diameter, and be fitted with a cast iron cover on which must be cast in raised letters, the letters "N.W." All valve boxes shall be made to extend from four to six feet and shall in all respects conform to the specifications known and designated as Deerfield Standard Specifications.

CAST IRON PIPE.

All pipes and castings shall be made of the best quality of metal and shall in all respects conform to the specifications known and designated as Deerfield Standard Specifications.

All pipes shall be laid and all excavating or other work performed in connection herewith shall be in accordance with said Deerfield Standard Specifications.

GUARANTEE.

SECTION 2. For the keeping and maintaining in a passable condition the streets in which pipes have been laid for a period of one year from and after the completion and acceptance of the work, which keeping and maintaining shall consist of refilling depressions, caused by a settling of the backfilling, the Village of Deerfield shall retain three (3) per cent of the contract price for the said work, and if the contractor or contractors for this improvement shall

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not within five (5) days after notice so to do, proceed to make such repairs as are required to be made, the said Board of Local Improvements shall immediately cause such repairs to be made and pay the cost thereof from any money of said contractor or contractors, in the possession of the Village of Deerfield.

The entire improvement hereinbefore provided for in this Ordinance shall be constructed under the superintendence of the Board of Local Improvements of the Village of Deerfield. All the material used in the construction of the improvement hereinbefore specified shall be of the best quality and of a kind specially adapted for the purpose for which it shall be used, and all the necessary labor shall be performed in a good and workmanlike manner.

SECTION 3. That the recommendation of the Board of Local Improvements of the Village of Deerfield providing for said improvement, together with the estimate of the cost thereof made by the Engineer of the Village of Deerfield, both thereto attached, be and the same are hereby approved.

SECTION 4. That the said improvement shall be made, and the whole cost thereof be paid for by special assessment, in accordance with An Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois, entitled, "An Act Concerning Local Improvements," approved June 14th, A. D. 1897, and amendments thereto; and that of the amount of said assessment to be collected as aforesaid, the sum of ONE THOUSAND, FIVE HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE and 50/100 DOLLARS (\$1,573.50), which sum does not exceed six (6) per cent of the amount of such assessment, shall be applied so far as may be required to the payment of all lawful expenses attending the proceedings for making said improvement, and the cost of making and collecting the assessment therefor, in accordance with the provisions of said Act.

SECTION 5. That the aggregate amount assessed, and each individual assessment, including the assessment against the Village of Deerfield, if there be any, shall be divided into Ten (10) installments, together with all of the fractional amounts, and the aggregate amount of each of the remaining installments shall be equal in amount and each multiple of one Hundred Dollars (\$100.00). Said first installment shall be due and payable on the day of January, A. D. 19... next after the date of the first voucher issued on account of work done on said improvement, and the second installment one year thereafter, and so on annually until all installments are paid. All installments shall bear interest until paid at the rate of five and one-half per cent (5½%) per annum, and interest on all assessments shall begin to run from the date of the first voucher issued on account of work done, as certified by said Board of Local Improvements to the Clerk of the Court in which the assessment therefor shall be confirmed.

The interest on each installment shall be payable as follows: On the 27th day of January next succeeding the date of the first voucher issued on account of work done on said improvement, so certified as aforesaid, the interest accrued up to that time on all unpaid installments shall be due and payable and collected with the installment, and thereafter the interest on all unpaid installments, then payable, shall be payable annually, and be due and payable at the same time as the installments maturing in such year and be collected thereon. In every instance, whenever payment is made by any installments, interest shall be collected thereon up to date of such payment.

SECTION 6. For the purpose of anticipating the collection of the second and succeeding installments of said assessment for said improvement, bonds shall be issued, payable out of all said installments bearing interest at the rate of 5½% per annum, payable annually, and signed by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Deerfield and attested by the Village Clerk, under the corporate seal of the said Village of Deerfield. Said bonds shall be issued in accordance with and shall in all respects conform to the provisions of the Act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois, entitled, "An Act Concerning Local Improvements," approved June 14th, A. D. 1897, and amendments thereto.

SECTION 7. That Elburn W. Colby, an attorney of the said Village be and he is hereby directed to file a petition in the County Court of Lake County, Illinois, in the name of the Village of Deerfield, praying that steps be taken to levy a special assessment for said improvement, in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance, and in the manner prescribed by law.

SECTION 8. That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances conflicting with this Ordinance shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 9. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication.
