BIG END WAS CONTINGENT

President of Shipbuilding Concern Explains \$5,000 Lobby Fee.

WASHINGTON. — F. T. Bowles, president of the Fore River Shipbuilding company, who was photographed in Washington after he had appeared before the senate lobby investigation committee, admitted that he had engaged Clarence W. De Knight to work for him against railroad-owned ship exclusion in the pending of the Panama canal act before the senate committee and that he had paid \$1,000 to De Knight.

A contingent fee of \$4,000 was not paid or demanded, he said, because the exclusion clause finally was incorporated in the act.

MAYOR IS SUED FOR \$100,000

Alleged to Have Beaten Newspaper Editor in Rock Island.

ROCK ISLAND, ILL. — Mayor H. M. Schriver and six members of the police force were made defendants in a suit for \$100,000 damages by John Looney, former publisher of the Weekly News.

Looney alleged he was injured when beaten in the city hall by Schriver two years ago. Looney had attacked the mayor in his paper. There was rioting at the time, which caused the bringing of state troops to Rock Island.

WASHINGTON. — Senator Tillman had read to the senate a magazine article he had written on the restoration of his health.

"I see some of the senators laughed while the clerk was reading," said the South Carolina senator. "I'll bury you fellows yet."

Illinois Leads in Zinc Smelting.

WASHINGTON. — Illinois led in the smelting of zinc in the year 1913 with an output of 106,654 tons, according to an announcement by the geological survey. Oklahoma was second with 83,214 tons, and Kansas third with 74,106 tons. The output in 1913 was the greatest in the history of the industry.
