GAS UP TO UTILITIES COMMISSION
Hearing Started Tuesday is Postponed Two Weeks

At a hearing before the Public Utilities Committee of the State of Illinois, held in Chicago on Tuesday afternoon, March 24th, Commissioner J. K. Orvis of Waukegan, Village President; Sherman M. Gobie of Winnetka, and Alderman Joseph L. Peering of Highland Park, were present, as were also the officers and attorney for North Shore Gas Co. After a great deal of discussion, and after the Public Utilities Commission had been very well convinced that the situation merited its attention the hearing was postponed for two weeks, pending the submission of more definite data from each municipality interested. It was also understood that other towns served by the North Shore Gas Co. wished to join in the complaint and the delay of two weeks will give them the opportunity to do so.
