GAS UP TO UTILITIES COMMISSION

Hearing Started Tuesday is Postponed Two Weeks

At a hearing before the Public Utilities Committee of the State of Illinois, held in Chicago on Tuesday afternoon, March 24th, Commissioner J. K. Orvis of Waukegan, Village President; Sherman M. Goble of Winnetka, and Alderman Joseph L. Fear ing of Highland Park, were present; as were also the officers and attorney for North Shore Gas Co.
