SPECIAL ASSESSMENT NOTICE NO. 214.

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that the City Council of the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois having ordered that Sheridan Road be graded, drained, curbed, paved with re-enforced concrete pavement and otherwise improved, from its intersection with the easterly line of St. Johns Avenue southeasterly to the northerly end of the new pavement in Dean Avenue, said northerly end of said new pavement being in the southerly line of Cedar Avenue, produced easterly, at the junction of Sheridan Road and Cedar Avenue, all in the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, the ordinance for the same being on file in the office of the City Clerk of said city and having applied to the County Court of Lake County for an assessment of the costs of said improvement according to benefits, and an assessment thereof having been made and returned to said court, the final hearing thereon will be had on the 17th day of April, A.
