

Hardy Flowering Plants

An Ordinance Fixing the Salaries of City Officers and Certain Employees of the City of Highland Park

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Highland Park:

Section 1. That the salaries of the following city officers and employees, be fixed at such a sum as is provided for by this ordinance for each officer, or employee, for the discharge of the duties of such office as required under the laws of the State of Illinois, and the ordinance of the City of Highland Park, during the term of his office or employment, commencing the first day of May A. D. 1914, and that such officer or employee shall receive no further compensation from the City of Highland Park, for the duties of such office during the term thereof.

That the salary of the foreman of Public Works be, and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) per annum.

That the salary of the city marshal be, and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) per annum.

That the salary of each of the police officers (except such policemen as are appointed for special duty and for a limited time less than a year) be and it is hereby fixed at the sum of Nine Hundred Dollars (\$900) per annum each.

That the salary of the Superintendent of Water Works, ex-officio Chief Engineer at the Water Works be and is hereby fixed at the sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars (\$1200.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Assistant Engineers at the Water Works be, and it is fixed at the sum of Nine Hundred Dollars (\$900.00) per annum.

That the salary of the assistant to the city treasurer be, and is hereby fixed at the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300) per annum.

That the salary of the assistant to the City Clerk be, and is hereby fixed at the sum of Eight Hundred and Forty Dollars (\$840.00) per annum.

That the salary of the stenographer in the City Clerk's office be and is hereby fixed at the sum of Six Hundred and Sixty Dollars (\$660.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Superintendent of Water and Sewer Mains, ex-officio sewer inspector, be and it is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Fire Marshall and Assistant Fire Marshall and Firemen, be and it is hereby fixed at the sum of One Dollar (\$ 1.00) for the first hour of attendance at each fire, and fifty cents (\$.50) per hour of actual service rendered for each hour thereafter.

That the salary of the assistant night fireman be, and is hereby fixed at Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) per annum.

That the salary of the city fireman in charge of the fire station shall be and is hereby fixed at Seven Hundred and Eighty Dollars (\$780.00) per annum.

That the salary of each alderman of the City of Highland Park be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) for each meeting, actually attended by him, not exceeding one meeting each week.

Section 2. That the salaries provided for in Section One of this Ordinance shall be due and payable in semi-monthly installments on the first and fifteenth day of each month for the preceeding half-month of their service during the term of their office.

Section 3. That the salary of the aldermen, city marshal, stenographer, and the city policemen, shall be paid from the "Salary of Officers" fund. That the salary of the Superintendent of the Water Works, ex-officio Chief Engineer, first and second assistant engineers, at the Water Works and city firemen, shall be paid from the water fund. That the salary of the Superintendent of Water and Sewer Mains shall be paid from the Water and Sewer Fund. That the salary of the foreman of Public Work shall be paid from the Street and Alley Fund. That the salary of the assistant to the City Treasurer be paid from the Miscellaneous and Contingent Fund. That the salary of the assistant to the city clerk be paid from the Miscellaneous and Contingent Fund, except for the actual work done on special assessments which said work shall be paid from the Special Assessment Expense Fund when such monies are available.

Section 4. That the salary of the City Collector be and is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand and Eighty Dollars (\$1080.00) per annum, payable in semi-monthly installments of Forty-five Dollars (\$45.00) each, and shall be paid from a fund to be created and composed of 2% of all special assessments and special taxes collected during each fiscal year, provided that in event of such commission not being sufficient, that such deficiency shall be paid from the Water Fund.

Section 5. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, and approval.
