SIXTH MUSIC FESTIVAL THIS MONTH

Five Concerts at Evanston by North Shore Association

The Chicago North Shore Musical Festival will offer at its five concerts this year some of the most attractive programs in the history of the organization. Four evening performances and one matinee will be offered in the Northwestern University gymnasium May 25, 26, 28 and 30. No music festival in the country will offer an array of solo artists so imposing as to numbers or so splendid as to quality. The great festival chorus of 600 singers, which in previous years has been one of the most impressive features of the concerts, will be heard again, for the performance of Haydn's oratorio, "The Creation," which will open the festival, the body of singers will be increased to 1000. In addition to the festival chorus, and the children's chorus of 1500 singers, there will be heard a choir of 300 voices drawn from the Evanston High School and the A Cappella Choir of Northwestern University. Peter Christian Lutkin, who has been musical director of the festivals since their foundation, will once more occupy that position, and Frederick Stock will conduct the orchestral performance. As in past years the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, in its full membership, will assist, and among the soloists will be Alma Gluck and Alice Neilson.

TALE OF A LOST MINE.

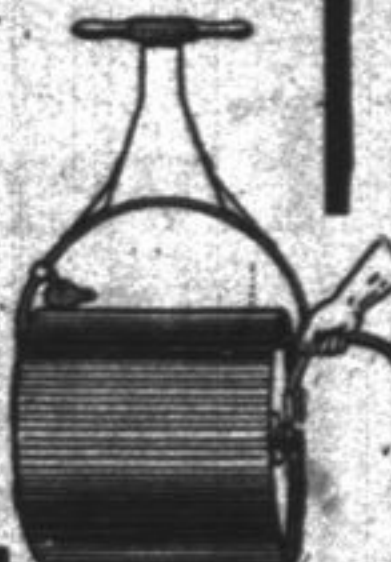

NEW SERIES OF STAMPS ISSUED

Five Denominations Principally for Parcel Post use are sent out

Postmaster Grady has been notified by the postmaster general that the department has issued five new denominations of stamps intended primarily for use on parcels, but valid for postage on all classes of mail. The denominations are seven, nine, twenty and thirty cents. The new stamps are of the same shape and the same size of the series of 1911. The colors are, seven cent, black; nine cent, pink; twelve cent, maroon; twenty cent, light blue and thirty cent, vermilion. The seven cent stamp bears the head of Washington, while the others have a picture of Franklin.
