

How the Fruit Changes From a Liquid to a Solid Substance.

Once considered useless, the ivory nut has become an important product and now adds considerably to Ecuador's export trade. Something like 20,000 tons are shipped from that country each year, worth about \$1,-700,000, while Colombia and Panama are both increasing their output.

The tree is a stunted paim fern with a short thick trunk which grows slowly to a height of ten to twenty feet, mirked by spiral lines or scars left by fallen leaves and fruit stems lenves resemble large gorgeous green feathers and are like those of the encount palm, while the blossoms are of pure white and very fragrant. seeds or kernels resulting from these are first in the form of sacks of sweek refreshing liquid that changes soft, delicious, edible pulp and finally becomes the hard nut of commerce. The nuts mature very slowly. requiring from blossom to ripeness fully a year. The gathering of green
