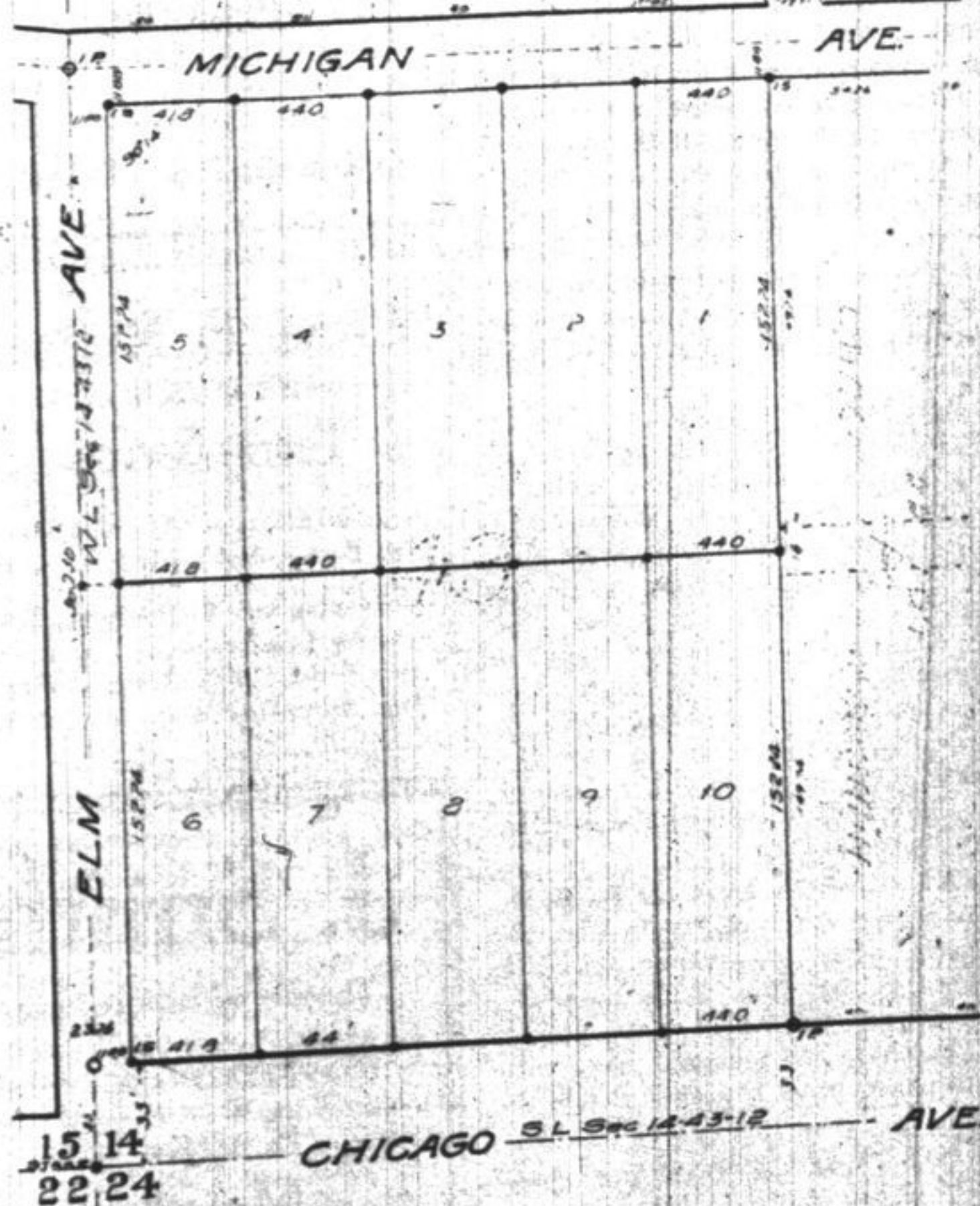

Obituary

Mrs. Hannah J. Wilson passed away on Saturday, June 6th, 1914, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Stewart R. Brown, 709 E. Lincoln Ave., after an illness of about two months.

Mrs. Wilson was born in the Province of Ulster, Ireland in the year 1844, of Scotch Irish Presbyterian stock, and was the only daughter of a family of eight children. One of her brothers was a prominent political leader, while another was a distinguished man of letters and barrister, holding degrees from Oxford and Trinity College, Dublin.

Mrs. Wilson was an earnest christian woman, holding fast to the faith of her forefathers who were Scotch Covenanters. She was a creditable representative of this illustrious family; was a close student of the affairs of the day, and when not reading her Bible, which was her daily textbook, she was following up the current topics of the hour. She was intensely interested in the Home Rule question pending now in her native land.

She is survived by two brothers, Alexander Thompson, remaining in Newry, Ireland, and Robert Thompson, Somerville, N. J., also three children, Mrs. Stewart R. Brown, Highland Park; W. T. Wilson, Winnipeg, Can., and David S. Wilson, Baggs, Wyo.

The remains were taken to Toronto, Can. for interment, where she lived during her early married life and where lies her husband, D. S. Wilson, who died some thirty years ago.

SHERIDAN ROAD NOTES

Improvement Association Busy at Winnetka and Kenilworth

On June 2nd, the council of Glencoe duly passed the ordinance turning over Sheridan Rd. which passes through that city to the Lincoln Park Board and same was accepted at a meeting of the Lincoln Park Board on June 10th.

The contract for paving Sheridan Road from St. Johns Ave. to Dean Ave. in Highland Park was let by the Common Council of that city Tuesday, June 2nd, and the piece just south of Ravinia Park and the bridge at the county line will be

put in order at once. When these last two jobs are finished, there will be a perfect road from the Naval Training Station, Lake Bluff, all the way south to Winnetka, a distance of about 17 miles.

Efforts are now being made to stimulate the work in Winnetka and at Kenilworth, which will undoubtedly soon be accomplished.

The various committees of the Sheridan Road Association are using their best endeavors in the several municipalities south of Winnetka to have ordinances passed for a complete good road, and are striving to have these communities pass ordinances the same as their northerly neighbors, have done, and which it is hoped they will soon do, so that their efforts for a continuous good highway all the way from Chicago to the Wisconsin State line may be accomplished with as little delay as possible.
