The Presbyterian Church of Chicago and vicinity are giving a series of programs in six centers of the city in the observance of Church and City Week, in which by stereopticon and demonstrations by foreigners the work of the church among immigrants and home mission settlements is being projected in a very attractive way. The demonstration for the north side churches will be held in the First Presbyterian Church of Evanston, next Sunday evening and Monday. The Highland Park Presbyterian Church will participate in the meetings Sunday evening from 9:30 to 10:00 o'clock. The following is the program for this meeting: Sunday, Nov. 15, morning service, sermons in the churches on the general subject of "The Church and the City Task" is suggested. 6:30-7:30 p. m., Young People's Union Service. Union meeting of societies in the group. Presiding—Mr. Walter R. Mee, Executive Secretary (formerly president) Chicago Christian Endeavor Union. Devotions—Rev. Frank T. Barry, Pastor Emerson Street Chapel. Speakers—Rev. P. R. De Carlo, Pastor Italian Christian Institute, Chicago; Rev. W. E. Parker, Jr., Associate Superintendent Church Extension Board. Special feature—Daily vacation Bible School Exercises; Mohammedian Call to Prayer, demonstrated by members of the Presian Mission. 7:30-8:15, Intermission for study of exhibit and stereopticon views of Presbyterian Mission work in Chicago. 8:15-10 p. m.—General meeting. Presiding—Rev. A. S. C. Clarke, D. D., Moderator of Chicago Presbytery and Pastor of Second Church, Evanston. Devotional service—Rev. Martin E. Anderson, Pastor Rogers Park Church. Speakers—Rev. R. Calvin Dobson, D. D., Pastor Highland Park Church; Rev. David Hugh Jones, D. D., Pastor Evanston First Church; Rev. Edgar P. Hill, Superintendent Church Extension Board. Special music—Anthem by First Church choir; Spanish solo by Mr. Samuel Martinez, of Presbyterian Mission to Spanish speaking people in Chicago.
