TO GET REFUND ON UNUSED TICKETS

Utilities Board Orders Company to Reimburse Holders of Monthly Tickets for Rides not Used During Month

The following item from one of the Chicago Sunday papers is of much interest to daily city-going Highland Parkers:

"Following general recommendations made by the Illinois public utilities commission the Chicago and Northwestern railroad has issued an order to all ticket agents providing for the redemption of all unused portions of monthly commutation tickets, according to a statement made yesterday afternoon by James E. Quan, chairman of the commission. The order provides for the redemption of all unused portions of monthly tickets between Chicago and Aurora, Elgin, Barrington, St. Charles, Waukegan, Winthrop Harbor, and intermediate points."

There are about three hundred and twenty-five monthly tickets sold in Highland Park every month and from the sixty rides on each ticket the large majority of commuters have from five to ten rides left. This means that if the order from the Illinois Public Utilities is enforced that 12 1/2 will be refunded for every ride that is not punched, that being the price paid for each ride.

The agent at Highland Park informs us that he has not yet received orders to comply with the commissions ruling. It is probable that the order will start from the first of next month.

Public Library Notes


