Special Assessment Notice Special Warrant No. 217

Public notice is hereby given that the county court of Lake County, Illinois, has rendered judgement for a special assessment upon property benefited by the following improvement: The construction of an eight inch main sanitary sewer together with manholes, flushing connections and house junctions to be constructed and laid in along and under Ridgewood Drive beginning at a manhole located 12 ft. northwest of the intersection of the center line of De Tamble Ave. and Ridgewood Drive running from thence northeasterly a distance of 230 ft. to the intersection of the center line of Gray Ave. with a line 19 ft. east of and parallel to the westerly line of Ridgewood Drive, at which point there shall be a manhole; running from thence northerly parallel to and 19 ft. east from the west line of Ridgewood Drive, a distance of 1210 ft. to a point 100 ft. south of the south line of Lincoln Ave., at which point there shall be a manhole, and at which point the sewer shall terminate, all in the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, as will more fully appear from the certified copy of the judgement on file in my office. That the warrant for collection of such assessment is in the hands of the undersigned.

All persons interested are hereby notified to call and pay the amount assessed at the collector's office, City Hall, corner Green Bay Rd. and Central Ave., Highland Park, Illinois, within thirty days from the date thereof.

Notice is further given that the said assessment is divided in five installments. That the amount of the first installment is \$460.00 and that each of the remaining installments is \$200.00. That all installments draw interest at the rate of 5 percent per annum from November 20th, 1914. The first installment is payable on the 2nd day of January, A. D. 1915.

The second installment one year thereafter and so on annually until all installments are paid.
