WILL HIGHLAND PARK WIN PENNANT?

Pennants for the Cities or Towns Selling the Largest Number of Seals



For the purpose of stimulating the sale of Red Cross Seals, by an inter-city competition throughout the United States, the American Red Cross and the National Association for the Study and Prevention of Tuberculosis will award pennants or banners to the county, city, town or village having the large sale of seals. The pennants will be of durable material, attractively prepared and will bear the name of the winning county, city or town, the number of seals sold per inhabitant, the year and other suitable wording.

Announcement of the winners of the pennants will be made on or before March 1, 1915, and a list of the winners will be published.

All Red Cross Seals sold by the agent must be sold for one cent. Donations of any amount in excess of the number of seals sold and delivered at one cent each, when 10 per cent of such proceeds is allowed to the American Red Cross and the proper percentage to the state or other appointing agents, may be counted as sales at one cent each.

Competing agents must not sell seals to persons living permanently outside of their territory, nor authorize persons outside of said territory to sell seals for them.

Reports of the sale of seals, duly certified and signed, must be mailed from the post office address of competing agents to the office of The National Association for the Study and Prevention of Tuberculosis, 105 East 22nd Street, New York, on or before midnight of February 20th, 1915. Counties, cities, towns or villages mailing reports after such date will not be recognized as eligible to compete in the contest. Reports must contain an account of the number of seals received; number of seals sold; the expense of the campaign; population for 1910; and per capita sale of seals.

MUST GIVE REAL VALUE IN TRANSFER

Will Assist Assessors in Placing Assessments on Real Estate

For many years in more than two-thirds of the warranty deeds filed in the office of the register of deeds the amount of consideration involved is not stipulated. "\$1 and other valuable consideration" being the stock phrase used by the majority.

Because of this fact it has never been possible for the assessors and others to get at the true value of property, hence the assessments have varied to a large extent. With the new war tax, which has just gone into effect, the law provides that deeds be taxed on a sliding scale according to the value of the property involved. This is taken to mean that hereafter the actual consideration will be stipulated in all transfers to permit proper appraisal of the tax.

Not so many years ago an attempt was made to remedy the custom of transfers and the "\$1 and other consideration" practice, by passing a law in the legislature making it compulsory for the persons interested in a real estate sale to name the true consideration, but it failed.

Now the war tax law appears to have brought about the remedy, and it remains to be seen whether this will be dodged. By scanning the records in the register of deeds' office last year, or following up the real estate transfers published from week to week, it will be seen that deed after deed contains the \$1 clause.

Tax experts have claimed this is done because the owner of property wants it assessed as low as possible.

SORE ARMS KEEP FIFTY PUPILS HOME

Result of Vaccination at the Waukegan High School. Compelled to Give up Athletics

The mandate, issued by Dr. C. E. Crawford of the state board of health, requiring that all pupils who attend high school at Waukegan, must be vaccinated against smallpox, has resulted in many sore arms. On Monday afternoon there were fifty students out of school on this account alone. The sore arms has caused a practical cessation of gymnasium work and if the condition grows any worse athletics for the time being may be at a standstill.

NEW GAME LAW

A new Game Law That Should be Passed by all States Would Contain the Following:

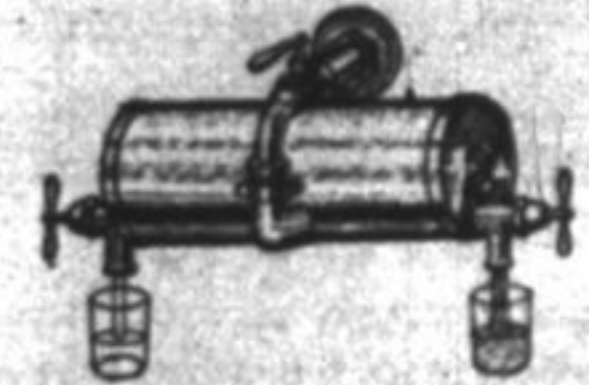
