

The setting of the house is of primary importance and many times does it occur that the house is placed in total ignorance of using the topography of the la to the best advantage. Ignorance or disrespect of this primary law is today responsible for the many failures in building homes on irregular lots especially. I cannot conceive of a more serious blunder than building the conventional box-liked two storied and more or less square hour place occurence. 
