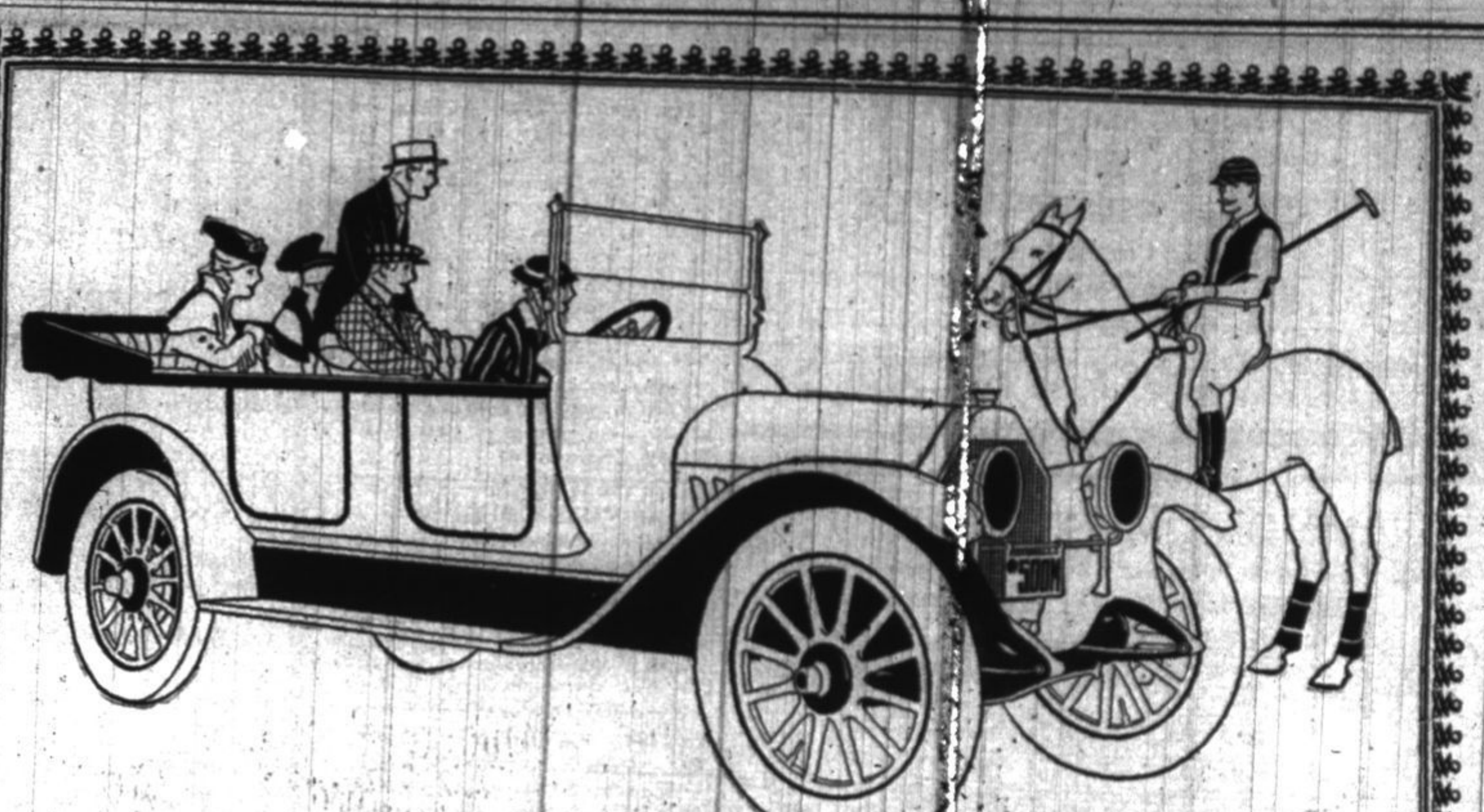

An Ordinance

To regulate the sale and use of fire crackers, dynamite caps, canes and pistols. Be it ordained by the council of the city of Highland Park.

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation, to sell or give away in the city of Highland Park, fire crackers two and one-half inches long or longer, dynamite tablets or dynamite caps of the kind used in canes and pistols, or pistols and canes using dynamite caps or tablets, and all fire works containing other explosives other than black powder.

Section 2. That the use of and discharge of fire crackers, two and one-half inches in length or longer, canes and pistols using dynamite caps or tablets, or the use and discharge of dynamite caps or tablets or fireworks and the use and discharge of all other fireworks containing other explosives other than black powder, be and the same is hereby prohibited in the city of Highland Park, Lake County, Ill.

Section 3. That any person or persons, firm or corporation violating any provisions of the foregoing ordinance shall be fined not to exceed \$10.00 for each and every offense.

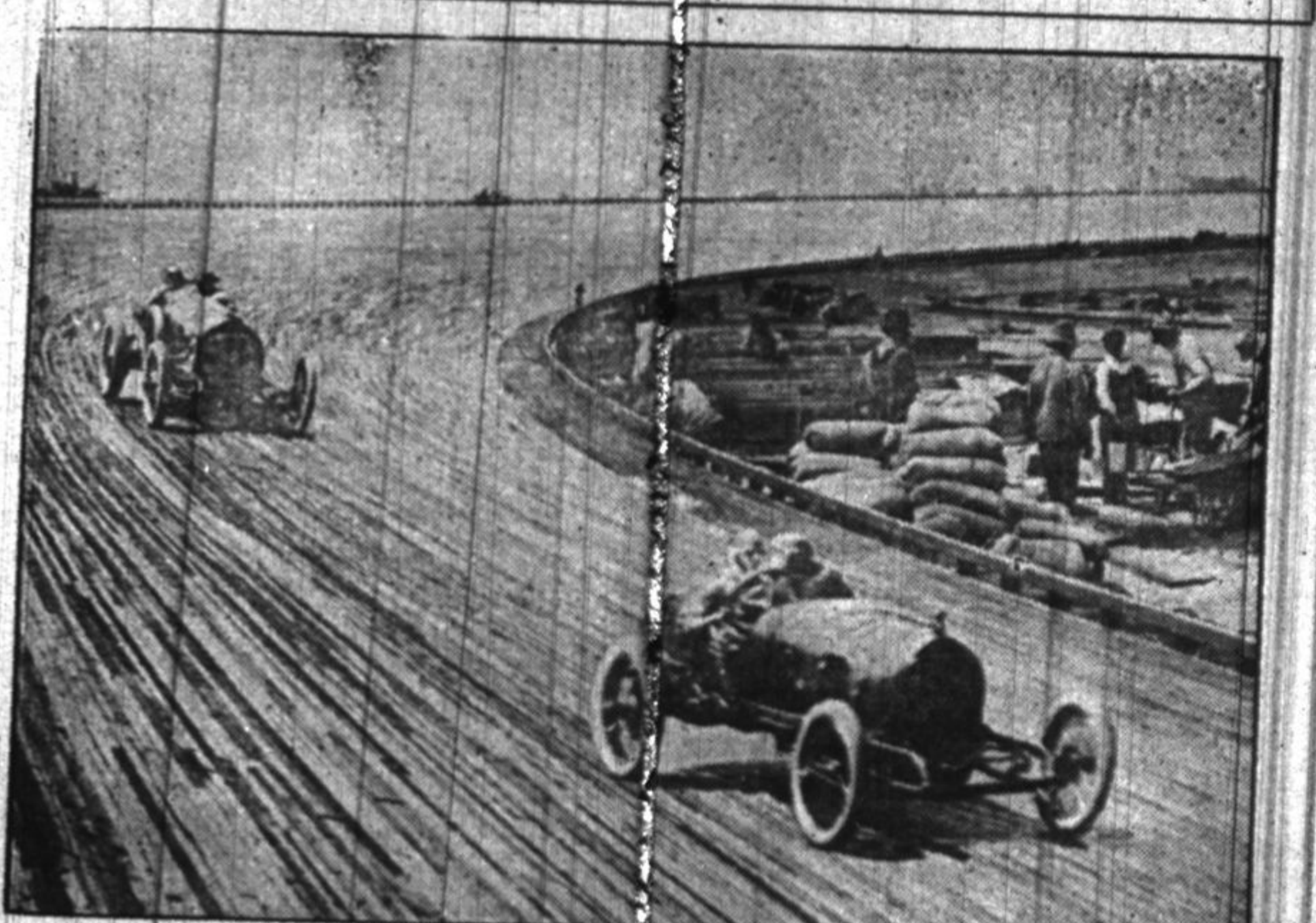
Section 4. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.

THE NEW SPEEDWAY PARK
 TWELFTH STREET AND DESPLAINES RIVER



The first elimination contests for the 500 mile International Auto Derby to be run next Saturday, indicate that all drivers who want a chance to share the \$54,000 prize money will have to show they can drive the course at a rate of over 100 miles per hour. So perfect is the design and construction of the great two mile wooden bowl that every driver seeking a place in the entry list realizes that Chicago's first great auto contest will probably see every world's record for speed broken. The initial trials by the three Stutz cars entered for the classic, broke the world's records for speed. Earl Cooper, in one of the Stutz racers, ripped off 20 miles at an average of 108.19 miles an hour. His fastest lap laid down a new mark for the speed demons to beat and made the sporting world gasp. This lap was done at the clip of 109.09 miles an hour and that was done while the new track was being given its official baptism of speed. The big wooden oval, which has up to now been dubbed "the tamarack bowl", was untested until Cooper made his sensational record spin and that speed star was merely trying out the course. In subsequent tests Wilcox, driving a Stutz, did the two mile turn at a rate of 108.68 miles an hour and Dario Resta with his Peugeot made it in the same time. Anderson's time with a Stutz was 104 miles an hour. The drivers say they can go faster on the turns than on the straightaway and hit the top at full speed without shutting off their engines.
