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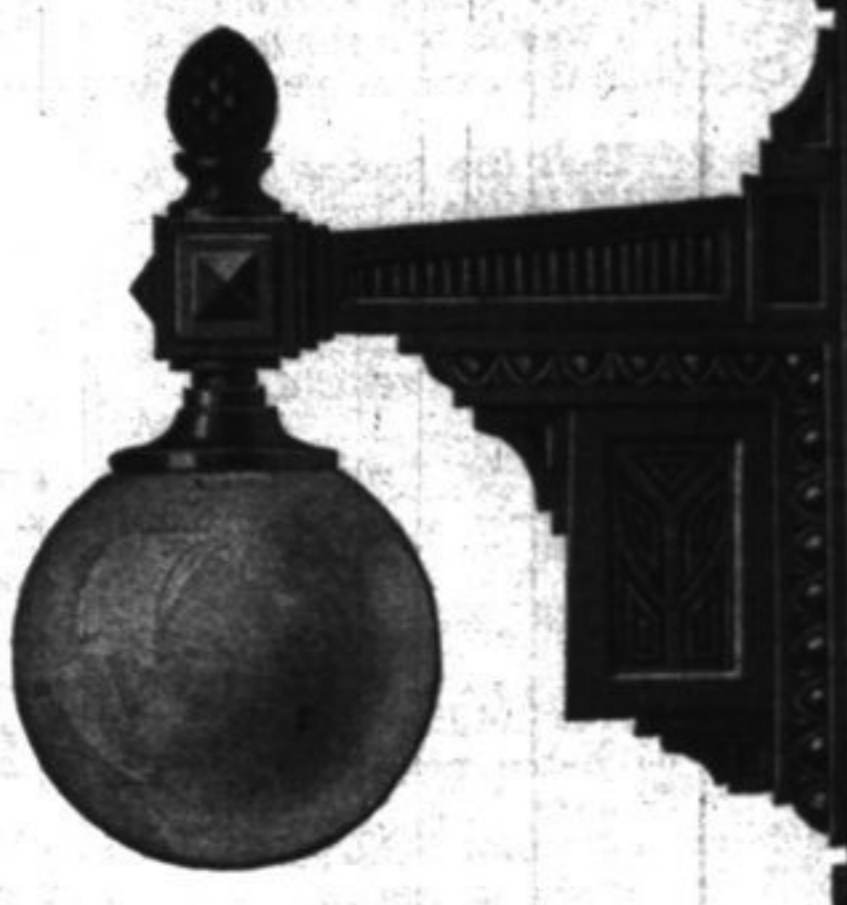
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Exmoor Club Notes

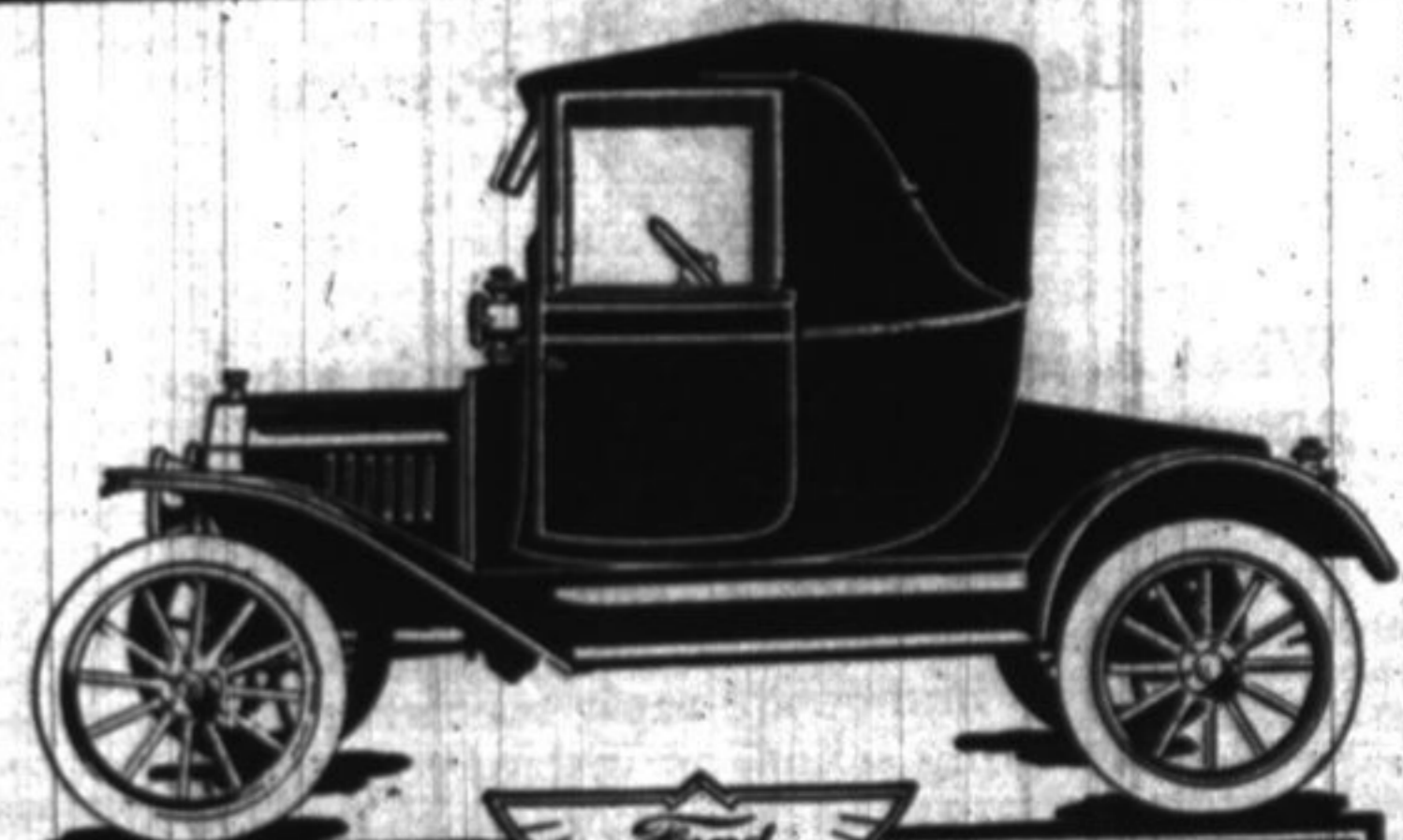
Next Monday evening, July 12, the Philathea Class will meet at the home of Miss Emma Evans, 14 S. First St.
