### NOTICE OF AWARING CONTRACT

Board of Local Improvements of the City of Highland Park. Notice is hereby given to all persons interested, that the bids for the furnishing of all labor, tools and materials necessary for the grading, draining, curbing, paving with macadam roadway having a bituminous macadam surface eighteen (18) feet wide, including concrete gutters, and otherwise improving Beech street from the easterly line of the paved roadway in St. Johns avenue, easterly to the westerly line of the concrete bridge herein provided for; St. Johns avenue from the southerly line of Lincoln avenue produced westerly across St. Johns avenue and southerly to the southerly line of Beech street produced westerly across St. Johns avenue; Forest avenue from the northerly line of Wade street, produced westerly southerly to the easterly line of the paved roadway in St. Johns avenue, herein provided; Linden avenue, southerly to the southerly line of Beech street, and constructing a reinforced concrete girder type bridge in Beech street, between Wade street and Linden avenue, spanning the ravine in Beech street, were opened on the 2nd day of July A. ### AN ORDINANCE FOR LICENSING VEHICLES

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Highland Park:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to use or cause or permit any of his or its agents or employees to use any wagon or other vehicle in the transportation of persons or property upon the streets, avenues or alleys of the city unless such wagon or vehicle be licensed as herein provided; however, that this ordinance shall not be construed as applying to street cars running on metallic rails.

Section 2. That any person, firm or corporation desiring a license for such wagon or vehicle shall file an application with the City Clerk, upon form provided by him, setting forth the name and address of the applicant, description of the wagon or vehicle which the license is desired and the place where such wagon or vehicle is to be kept when not in use; also the number and kind of other wagons or vehicles kept by said applicant at such place and such information as may be prescribed; such application shall be transmitted to the Mayor of the City and upon the payment by the applicant of the license fee hereinafter provided to the City Collector, the Mayor of the City shall issue or cause to be issued a license, which shall be attested by the City Clerk authorizing the use of such wagon or vehicle within the City until the expiration of such license.

Section 3. That the license fees to be paid annually to the City of Highland Park shall be as follows: One-horse wagon or vehicle, Two Dollars; Two-horse wagon or vehicle, Three Dollars; Three-horse wagon or vehicle, Six Dollars; Four-horse wagon or vehicle, Eight Dollars; Six-horse wagon or vehicle, Twelve Dollars; Motor Bicycles or Motor Tricycles of 35 horse power or less, Five Dollars; Automobiles and motor vehicles of 35 horse power or less, used for the transportation of persons, exclusive of trucks, coaches, omnibuses and motor vehicles used for commercial purposes, Five Dollars; Automobiles and motor vehicles of more than 35 horse power used for the transportation of persons, exclusive of trucks, coaches, omnibuses and motor vehicles used for commercial purposes, Ten Dollars; Motor driven commercial vehicles used for light delivery purposes carrying one ton or less, Ten Dollars; Automobiles, trucks, coaches, omnibuses, and other motor vehicles used for commercial purposes (except light motor driven commercial vehicles used for light delivery purposes, carrying one ton or less), Thirty Dollars.

All such licenses shall expire on the 30th day of April, following the date of issue and when issued for a period of less than one year the fee to be paid for the unexpired period, shall be the proportionate part of the annual rate fixed by the ordinance; but no fee shall be less than one-fourth of the annual rate.

All revenues derived from such license fees shall be kept as a separate fund and used for paying the cost and expenses of repairing or improving the streets or alleys of the city.

Section 4. That upon the issuance of said license, the City Clerk shall deliver to the applicant a metal plate bearing a number and the name of the class to which such wagon or vehicle belongs and the year for which such license is issued and it shall be the duty of the applicant to affix such plate in a conspicuous place upon the right side of such wagon or vehicle or upon the right side of the horse drawing such wagon or vehicle where it can readily be seen; and it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to use or cause or permit any agent or employee to use any such wagon or vehicle, although duly licensed, upon the streets, avenues or alleys of the City unless such plate is affixed as above provided; provided, however, that it shall not be necessary for owners of automobiles, or motor bicycles or motor tricycles to have the metal plate, bearing number provided for in this section, attached to such vehicle, and, provided further, that it shall not be necessary for any wagon or vehicle to have the aforesaid metal plate attached to it except when actually in use upon the streets, avenues, or alleys of the city.

Section 5. That any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00); for each such offense, and each day any wagon or vehicle is used upon the streets, avenues or alleys of the City without having complied with the provisions of this ordinance, shall be considered a separate and distinct offense.

Section 6. That nothing contained in this ordinance shall be construed as in any manner repealing any ordinance or parts of ordinances as amended and as now in force in the City of Highland Park, relating to any particular business now being licensed by the city of Highland Park, wherein wagons or other vehicles are being used upon the streets, avenues or alleys of the city.

Section 7. That this ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that the city council of the city of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois having ordered that an ordinance providing for the construction of an eight inch sanitary sewer with manholes, flushing connections, and house junctions to be constructed and laid in, along and under Oak St., beginning at the manhole of the present sewer located in the intersection of said Oak St. and Broadway, running thence southerly on a line twenty-one (21) feet from and parallel with the west line of Oak St. a distance of three hundred and forty (340) feet at which point there shall be a manhole and at which point the sewer shall terminate. All in the city of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois and providing for the making of said improvement by special assessment and the issuing of improvement bonds, the ordinance for the same being on file in the office of the city clerk of said city and having applied to the county court of Lake County for an assessment of the costs of said improvement according to benefits, and an assessment thereof having been made and returned to said court, the final hearing thereon will be had on the 16th day of July A. D. 1915, or as soon thereafter as the business of the court will permit.

Said assessments is payable in three installments, with interest at the rate of five (5) per centum per annum on all installments from and after date of issue of first voucher. All persons desiring may file objections in said court before said day and may appear on the hearing and make their defense.
