**Notice of Special Election**  
Notice is hereby given to the voters of the City of Highland Park that a special election will be held in and for said City, on Saturday, August 21st, 1915 for the purpose of submitting to the voters, for their approval or rejection, an ordinance as follows:

**AN ORDINANCE**  
Authorizing the issuance of General Corporate Bonds to the amount of Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$16,000) and providing for the payment thereof.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Highland Park:  
Section 1. That there shall be borrowed on the credit of the City of Highland Park the sum of Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$16,000.00) for corporate purposes and to evidence such loan, there is hereby ordered issued negotiable interest bearing bonds of said City to said amount. Said bonds shall be designated "General Corporate Bonds," shall be Sixteen (16) in number, numbered from One (1) to Sixteen (16) inclusive and of the denomination of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) each, shall bear date October 1, 1915, and shall become due and payable as follows:

Bond numbers, 1 to 16; Aggregate amount, \$16,000.00; Due date and payable, October 1, 1917.

Said bonds shall bear interest from their date until paid at the rate of Five per cent (5) per annum payable semi-annually on the first day of April and October in each year, which interest payments to the date of maturity of the principal shall be evidenced by proper coupons attached to each bond and both principal and interest shall be payable in gold coin of the United States of America of the present standard of weight and fineness at the office of the First National Bank of Chicago in the City of Chicago, Illinois.

Section 2. That each of said bonds shall be substantially in the following form, respectively, to-wit:

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That the City of Highland Park in the County of Lake and State of Illinois acknowledges to owe and for value received, hereby promises to pay to bearer One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) on the first day of October, A. D. 1917, with interest thereon from date hereof at the rate of Five per cent (5) per annum, payable semi-annually on the annexed coupon and surzender of the become due as they severally shall be. Both principal and interest on this bond are hereby made payable in gold coin of the United States of America of the present standard of weight and fineness at the First National Bank of Chicago, in the City of Chicago, Illinois.

This bond is one of a series of like tenor (except number) issued for corporate purposes under the authority of Chapter XXIV of the Revised Statutes of the State of Illinois and of an

ordinance of the City of Highland Park duly passed and approved by the Council of the City of Highland Park.

It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuing of this bond have been done, happened and been performed in regular and due form as required by law and that the total indebtedness of the City of Highland Park, including this bond does not exceed the statutory or constitutional limit; that the ordinance above mentioned has been submitted to the voters of said City at an election duly called and held for that purpose and approved by a majority of said voters voting upon the question and that the provision has been made for the collection of a direct annual tax in addition to all other taxes on all taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the interest thereon as it falls due and also to pay and discharge the principal hereof at maturity.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the City of Highland Park, Illinois, by its council, has caused this bond to be sealed with its corporate seal, signed by its Mayor and attested by its City Clerk, and has caused the annexed interest coupons to be executed with the facsimile signatures of said officers this first day of October, A. D. 1915.

Section 3. That for the purpose of providing for the payment of the principal and interest of the bonds hereby authorized as they respectively become due, there shall be and there is hereby levied and there shall be collected a direct annual tax upon all taxable property in the City of Highland Park, Illinois, sufficient to produce the following sums for the following years:  
For the year 1915, Eight Hundred Dollars (\$800.00)  
For the year 1916, Sixteen Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$16,800.00)  
and provision to meet the requirements of this section shall be included in the annual appropriation bill for each of the years aforesaid and the City of Highland Park hereby obligates itself annually in due time, manner and season to perform and take all action required by law to

carry out the provisions of this section, and the City Clerk of the City of Highland Park is hereby directed forthwith to file a certified copy of this ordinance with the County Clerk of Lake County, Illinois, to the end that said County Clerk may, in each of said years 1915 and 1916, both inclusive, and in accordance with the provisions imposed upon him by law, ascertain the rate per centum required to produce the aggregate tax hereinbefore levied for such year and extend the same for collection upon the tax rolls in connection with the tax levied for such year by said City for general City purposes and in each of said years the annual bond tax shall be collected in the same manner as the taxes levied by said City for general purposes for such years are collected and when collected shall be used solely for the purpose of paying the interest and principal of the bonds hereby authorized, as long as any of said bonds remain outstanding.

Section 4. The bonds hereby authorized shall be issued and sold from time to time as the proceeds are needed for the purpose authorized by this ordinance.

Section 5. The bonds authorized by this ordinance shall not be issued unless this ordinance is approved at an election which is hereby called to be held on the 21st day of August, 1915.

Section 6. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.

Annual Appropriation Bill

An ordinance making appropriations for the corporate purposes for the fiscal year from June 1, 1915 to May 31, 1916.

Be it ordained by the board of commissioners of the Highland Park East Park District of the City of Highland Park County of Lake and State of Illinois:

Section 1. That the following sums, or so much thereof as may be authorized by law, be and the same are hereby appropriated for corporate purposes for the fiscal year commencing June 1, 1915, and ending May 31, 1916

Park, Boulevards, Driveways and Boating Basins

For acquiring, laying out, establishing, constructing and maintaining park boulevards, driveways, and boating basins \$800.

Salaries of Officers

For salaries of secretary, treasurer, attorney, engineer, clerk and other employees, including a police force \$300.

Total Amount Appropriated \$1,000

Section 2. All unexpended balances of any item or items of any general appropriations made by this ordinance may be expended in making up any deficiency in any item or items in the same general appropriation and for the same general purpose or in a like appropriation made by this ordinance.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.
