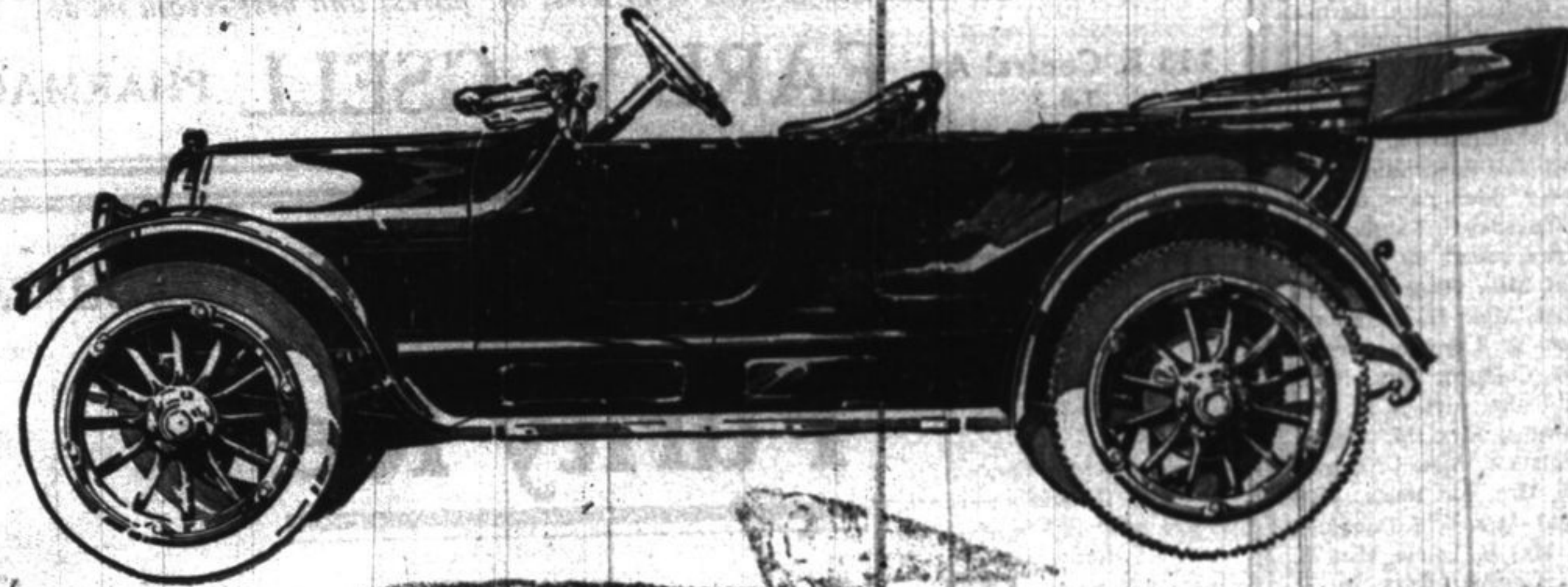

A light brushing will remove dust from its smooth surface, and soap and water will take out grease or oil spots.

Notice of Special Election  
Notice is hereby given to the voters of the City of Highland Park that a special election will be held in and for said City, on Saturday, August 21st, 1915 for the purpose of submitting to the voters, for their approval or rejection, an ordinance as follows:

AN ORDINANCE  
Authorizing the issuance of Bridge Bonds to the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and providing for the payment thereof.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Highland Park:

Section 1. That there shall be borrowed on the credit of the City of Highland Park the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), for the purpose of constructing bridges in and for said City, and to evidence such loan there is hereby ordered issued negotiable interest bearing bonds of said City to said amount. Said bonds shall be designated "Bridge Bonds," shall be ten (10) in number from One (1) to Ten (10) inclusive, and of the denomination of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) each; shall bear date of October 1st, 1915, and shall become due and payable as follows:

Bond numbers 1 to 10: Aggregating in amount, \$10,000.00; Due date and payable, October 1, 1917.  
Said bonds shall bear interest from their date until paid at the rate of Five per cent (5) per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of April and October of each year, which interest payments to the date of maturity of the principal shall be evidenced by proper coupons attached to each bond; and both principal and interest shall be payable in gold coin of the United States of America of the present standard of weight and fineness at the office of the First National Bank of Chicago in the City of Chicago, Illinois.

Section 2. That each of said bonds and each of the interest coupons to be thereto attached shall be substantially in the following forms, respectively, to-wit:

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE  
PRESENTS, That the City of High-

land Park in the County of Lake and State of Illinois acknowledges to owe and for value received, hereby promises to pay to bearer Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) in gold coin of the United States of America of the present standard of weight and fineness at the First National Bank of Chicago, in the City of Chicago, Illinois, for interest due on that day on its bridge bond dated October 1, 1915, number

This bond is one of a series of like tenor (except number) issued for the purpose of constructing bridges in and for the City of Highland Park under the authority of Chapter XXIV of the Revised Statutes of the State of Illinois and of an ordinance of the City of Highland Park duly passed and approved by the Council of the City of Highland Park.

It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuing of this bond have been done, happened and been performed in regular and due form as required by law and that the total indebtedness of the City of Highland Park, including this bond does not exceed the statutory or constitutional limit; that the ordinance above mentioned has been submitted to the voters of said City at an election duly called and held for that purpose and approved by a majority of said voters voting upon the question, and that the provision has been made for the collection of a direct annual tax in addition to all other taxes on all taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the interest thereon as it falls due and also to pay and discharge the principal hereof at maturity.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the City of Highland Park, Illinois, by its Council, has caused this bond to be sealed with its corporate seal, signed by its Mayor and attested by its City Clerk, and has caused the annexed interest coupons to be executed with the facsimile signatures of said officers this first day of October, A. D. 1915.

On the first day of April (and October) 1915, the City of Highland Park, Illinois, promises to pay to bearer Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) in gold coin of the United States of America of the present standard of weight and fineness at the First National Bank of Chicago, in the City of Chicago, Illinois, for interest due on that day on its bridge bond dated October 1, 1915, number

Section 3. That for the purpose of providing for the payment of the principal and interest of the bonds hereby authorized as they respectively become due, there shall be and there is hereby levied and there shall be collected a direct annual tax upon all taxable property in the City of Highland Park, Illinois, sufficient to produce the following sums for the following years:

For the year 1915, Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00)  
For the year 1916, Ten Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (10,500.00)

and provision to meet the requirements of this section shall be included in the annual appropriation bill for each of the years aforesaid. And the City of Highland Park hereby obligates itself annually in due time, manner and season to perform and take all action required by law to carry out the provision of this section. And the City Clerk of the City of Highland Park is hereby directed forthwith to file a certified copy of this ordinance with the County Clerk of Lake County, Illinois, to the end that said County Clerk may in each of said years of 1915 and 1916, both inclusive, and in accordance with the provisions imposed upon him by law, ascertain the rate per centum required to produce the aggregate tax hereinafore levied for such year and extend the same for collection upon the tax rolls in connection with the tax levied for such year by said City for general City purposes and in each of said years the said annual bond tax shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as the taxes levied by said City for general purposes for such years are collected and when collected shall be used solely for the purpose of paying the interest and principal of the bonds hereby authorized, as long as any of said bonds remain outstanding.

Section 4. The bonds hereby authorized shall be issued and sold from time to time as the proceeds are needed for the purposes authorized by this ordinance.

Section 5. The bonds authorized by this ordinance shall not be issued unless this ordinance is approved at an election which is hereby called to be held on the 21st day of August, 1915.

Section 6. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.

Special Assessment Notice No. 222

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that the city council of the city of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois having ordered that an eight inch sanitary sewer together with manholes and house junctions be constructed and laid in, along and under Judson Ave., beginning at a point in the center line of said Judson Ave. ten feet north of its intersection with the northerly line of Ava St., produced easterly, thence northerly on said center line two hundred and sixty feet (260 ft.) thence north 17 1/2 degrees east 82 feet to and connecting into a manhole in the present sewer in lot 3, block 57, in the city of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, the ordinance for the same being on file in the office of the city clerk of said city and having applied to the county court of Lake County for an assessment of the costs of said improvement according to benefits, and an assessment thereof having been made and returned to said court, the final hearing thereon will be had on the seventh day of August A. D. 1915 or as soon thereafter as the business of the court will permit.
