Its Production Was Attended With Difficulties.

When Daisy Allison, who had made a bit in amateur theatricals, noticed in a newspaper that film companies were inviting persons owning handsome places to furnish scenarios for picture plays...

She entered upon her work at once, her first act being to write a note to Mr. Howard Ashley, a playwright, stating her design and asking him if he would officiate in the construction of the play.
