MILITARY CARS REACH PACIFIC COAST

First Overland Trip Made by Cadets. Col. Davidson in Command

Battling through numerous storms and over seemingly impassible roads, eight Cadillac military motors, which comprise the first military motor caravan ever to make a transcontinental trip, arrived in Los Angeles, Cal. Wednesday, July 21st. The machines are manned by cadets from the Northwestern Military Academy; under command of Colonel Davidson.

The 1910 machine, which acts as a balloon destroyer, has a record of having covered the country from the Atlantic to the Pacific ocean, and from the St. Lawrence river to the Gulf of Mexico.

An officers' reconnoissance car also is included in the caravan. A detailed report of the trip, including maps of the roads traversed, will be forwarded to the war department within the next few days, according to Col. Davidson.


