### BOARD OF REVIEW COMPLETES WORK

Total Valuation of Lake County Property is \$23,338,885.00

The Lake County Board of Review Saturday completed the work of making out their report of the value of personal property, lands and lots for the year 1915. The total valuation of all property in Lake county as shown by the board's figures for this year is \$23,338,885. This is an increase of \$3,085,670 over the valuation as fixed by the board last year, and an inof \$4,256,776 over the assessors' figures for the year 1915. This is considered a most phenomenal increase, being even larger than the increase of last year, which was \$2,438,895 higher than that of the preceding year.

The big increase this year is found in personal property where the increase over the assessors' figures was \$4,315,940. The increase is attributed to the increases in valuation placed by the board on property of Richard W. Sears, Nelson A. Steele and Frank Deming, all deceased.

In the lands there was an increase of \$12,185 over the assessors' figures. In lots there was a decrease of \$71,-
