"Well," replied the boy thoughtfully, "after I've been a minister to please mother and a judge to please father I'm going to be a policeman."—New York Times.

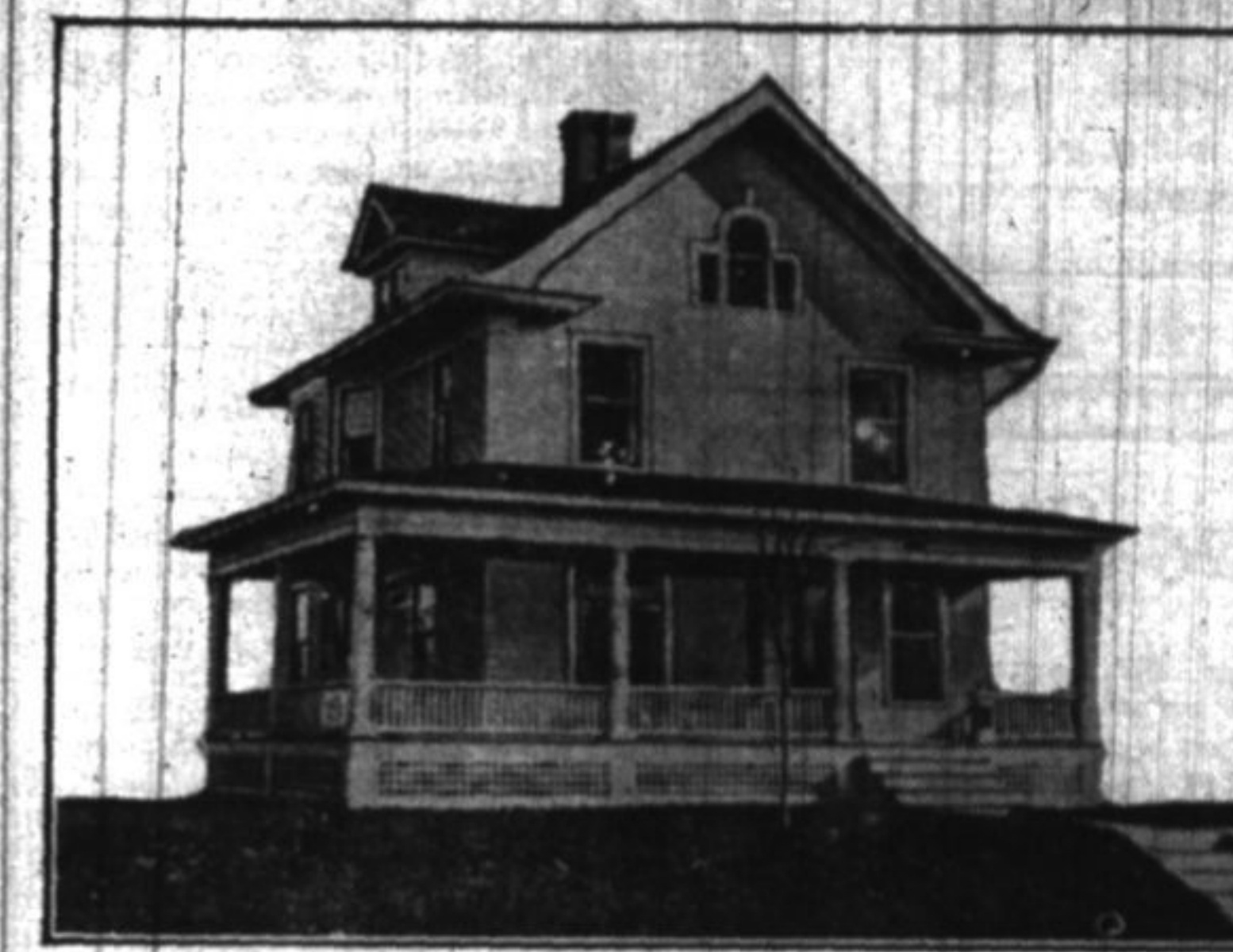

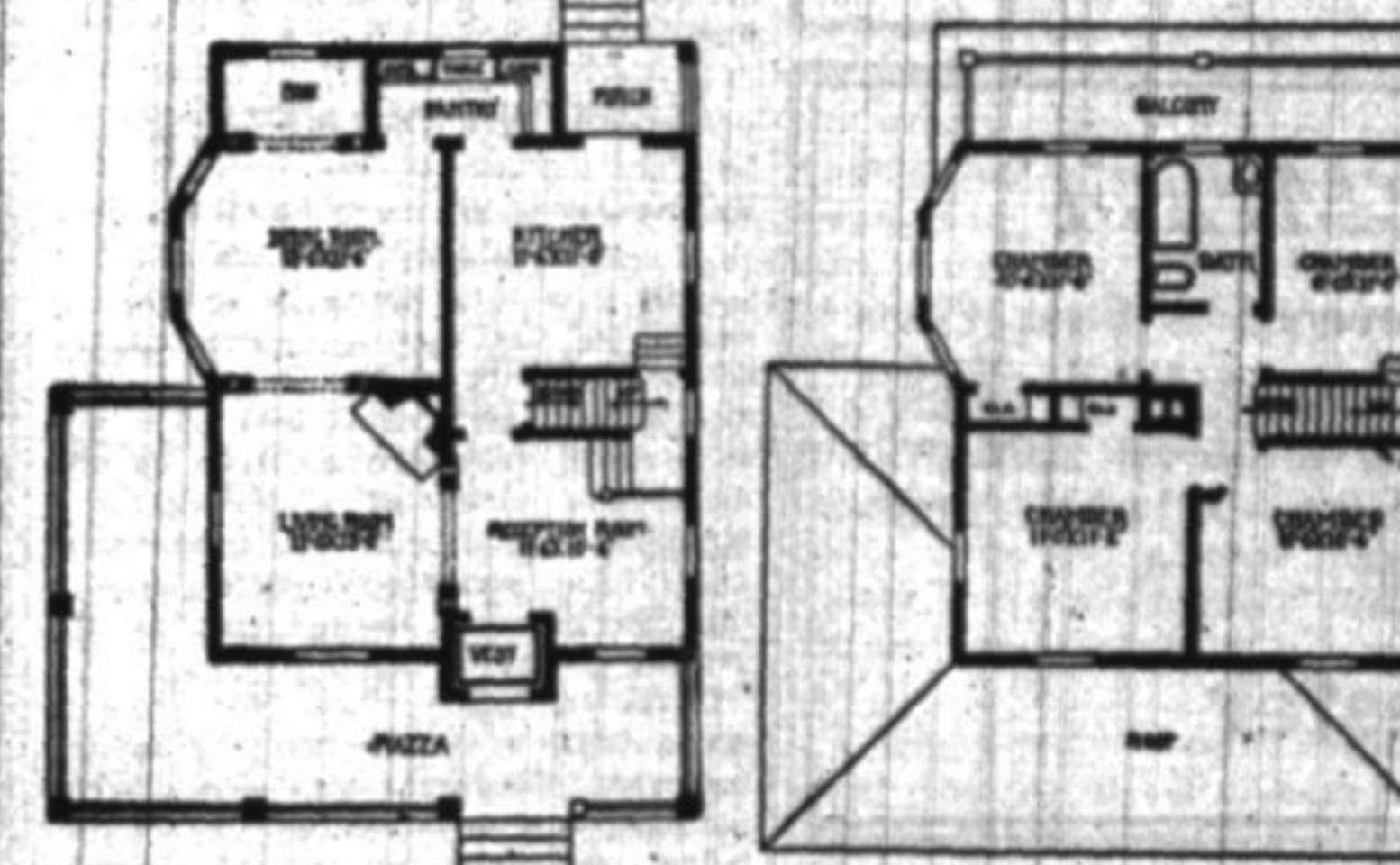

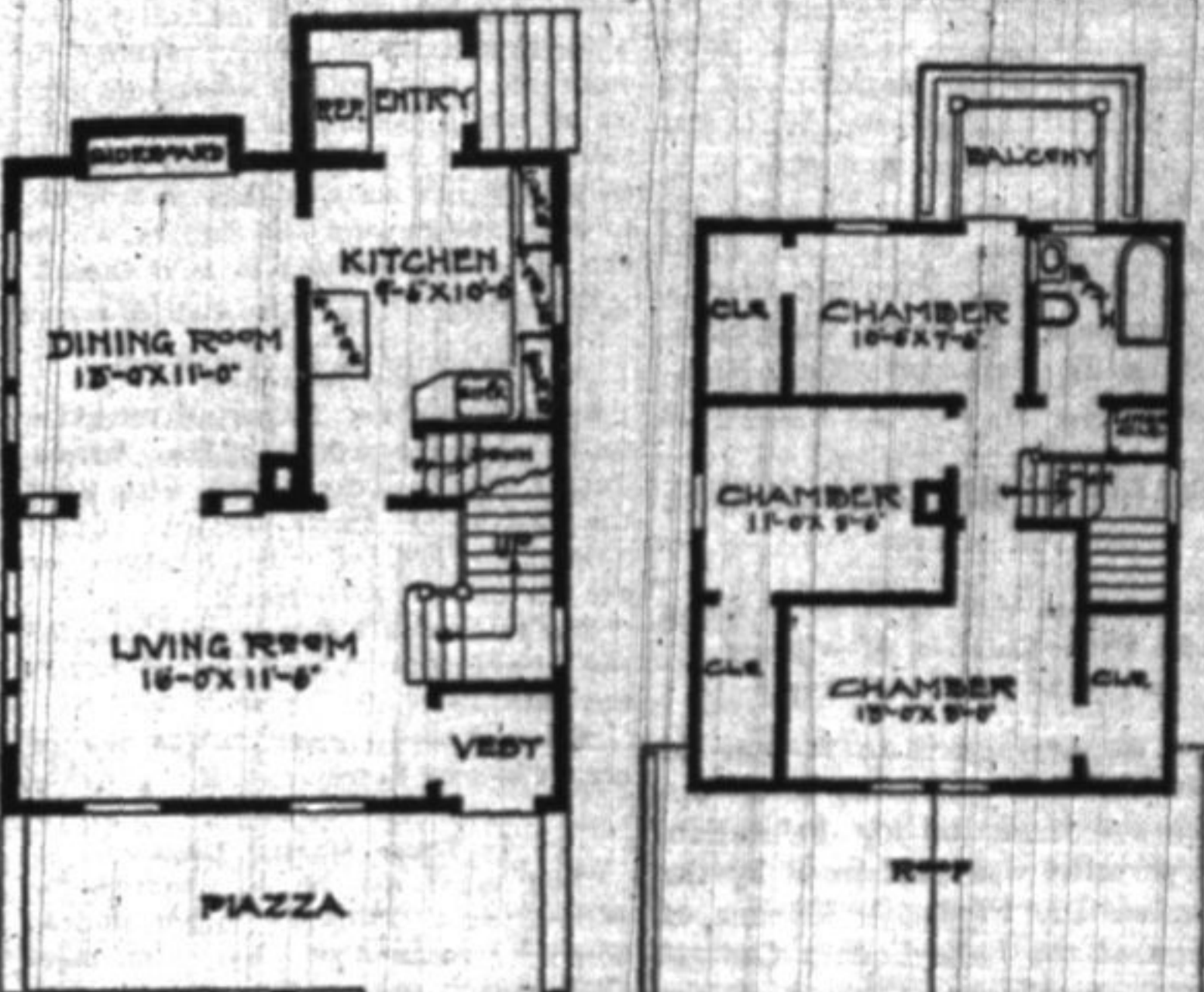
