CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

(Continued from page 1)

Bowen W. Schumacher, attorney for Charlotte Lewis, presented a plat being a subdivision of a part of Block 1, Exmoor Addition to Highland Park, and parts of Lots 1, 9 and 10 in Block 36, for approval.

Commissioner Willits moved the adoption of a resolution as follows:

RESOLVED that the plat entitled a Subdivision of part of Block 1, Exmoor Addition to Highland Park, be and the same is hereby approved, provided that the approval of this plat does not obligate the city in any way to accept any of the streets in said subdivision and that they pay all expenses in connection with same.

The motion prevailed.
Commissioner Hitchcock moved that the bond of Peter Hutter as Special Police Officer at the Elm Place crossing of the Chicago & Northwestern Railway in the sum of \$500 with Herbert O. Huber and Vessel Musik as sureties be approved. The motion prevailed.

Corporation Counsel Holmes made a request to be allowed to purchase a needed steel filing cabinet to contain city data in his office. Request was granted.

The following letter was read by Mr. Turpin from the Civic Improvement Association:

January 6th 1916.

To the Honorable Mayor and Commissioners of Highland Park Gentlemen:

Referring to your letter of Dec. 3rd in which we requested that steps be taken to secure better protection at the Lincoln Ave. crossing and our verbal report at a subsequent meeting of the Commissioners, we wish to advise:

That upon taking the matter up with the Chicago & Milwaukee Electric Railroad, as per your suggestion, we found that the only action which that Company was inclined to favor was the possible installation of an electric bell warning signal, which we do not believe would afford adequate protection, owing to the large number of school children who are obliged to cross the tracks at this point.

The matter being further considered at a meeting of our Association held on the 5th inst., the following motion was duly passed:

"Moved, That it is the sense of this meeting that the Executive Committee request the Commissioners of the City of Highland Park to have the Chicago & Milwaukee Electric R. R. place a flagman at the Lincoln Ave. crossing".

Corporation Counsel Holmes was delegated to again see Judge Landis in the hope of obtaining more satisfactory protection than an electric bell. Mr. Turpin also made request that the sidewalk between Railroad Avenue and Ava Street be repaired and a railing put on the bridge. The request was granted.

Commissioner Bahr moved that the resignation of Chas. L. Boyd as City Marshal be accepted. The motion prevailed.

Commissioner Willits moved that the report presented by the Police Commission remain on file for one week. The motion prevailed.

Council adjourned until eight-thirty.

The council convened at eight-thirty p. m. and proceeded to business, the following members being present: Mayor Hastings, Commissioners Hitchcock, Bahr and Huber.

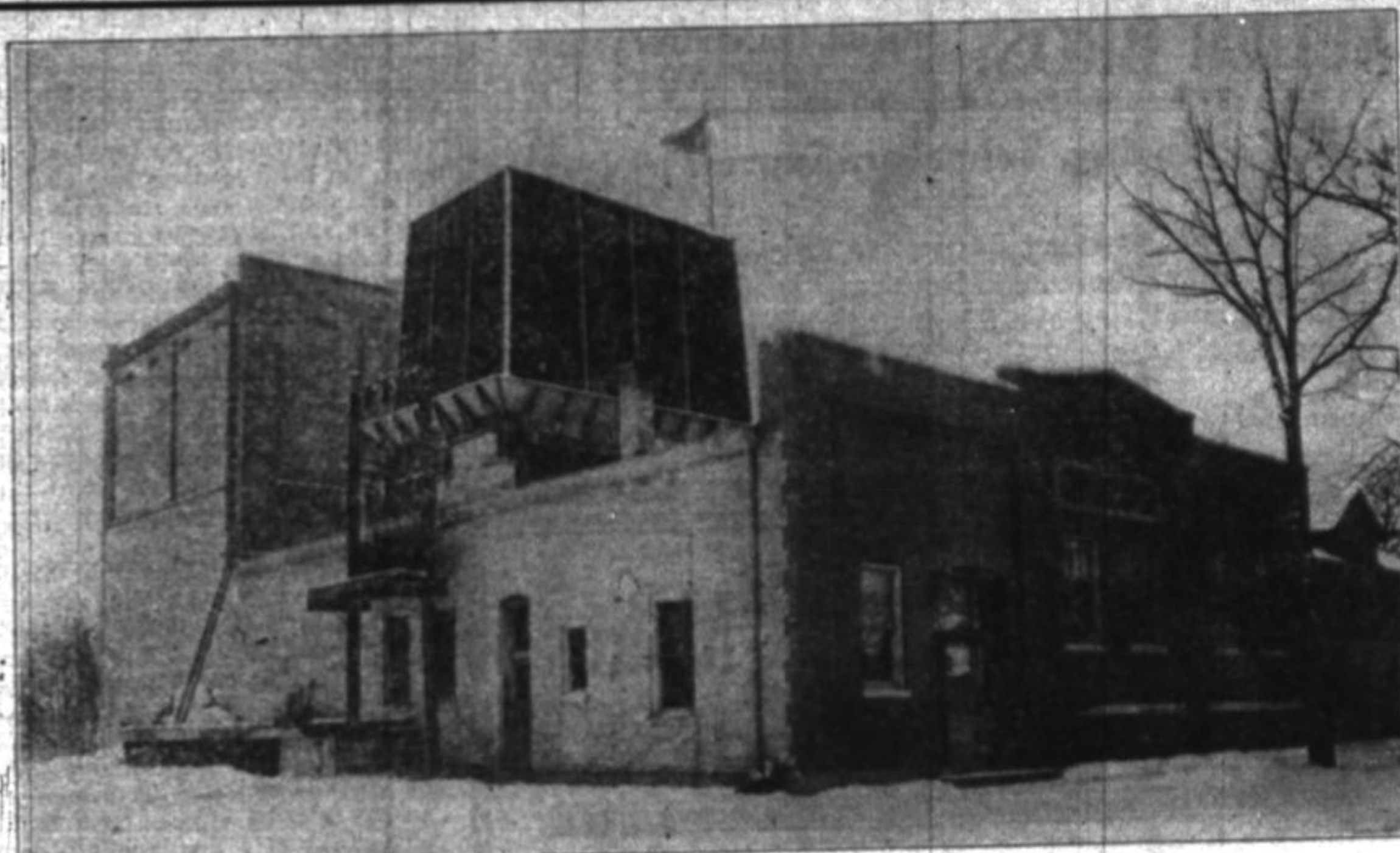
The Board of Local Improvements submitted and recommended the adoption of an ordinance providing for the grading, draining, curbing, paving with a brick block paved roadway, twenty feet in width, laid upon a crushed limestone foundation, and otherwise improving Green Bay Road from a point ten feet north of the intersection of its center line with the southerly line of Central Avenue southerly to its intersection with the south corporate limits of the city.

Commissioner Bahr moved the adoption of the ordinance as read. The motion prevailed.

The Board of Local Improvements submitted and recommended the adoption of an ordinance providing for the grading, draining, paving with concrete pavement having a bituminous concrete surface and otherwise improving Judson Avenue from the Northwestern line of Dean Avenue northerly for a distance of 2,075 feet, including a bridge to be located spanning the ravine intersecting Judson Avenue west from the south line of Roger Williams Avenue southerly to the paved roadway herein provided for in Kincaid Street. Kincaid Street from the southerly line of Lot 114 of South Highland Addition extended west, north to the paved roadway hereinafter provided for in Bronson Street, excepting the paved roadway at the intersection of Roger Williams Avenue; Marshman Street from the westerly line of Judson Avenue easterly for a distance of 1,175 feet, excepting the paved roadway herein provided for in Judson Avenue; Wade
