 Theatre to Appear March 3rd and 4th

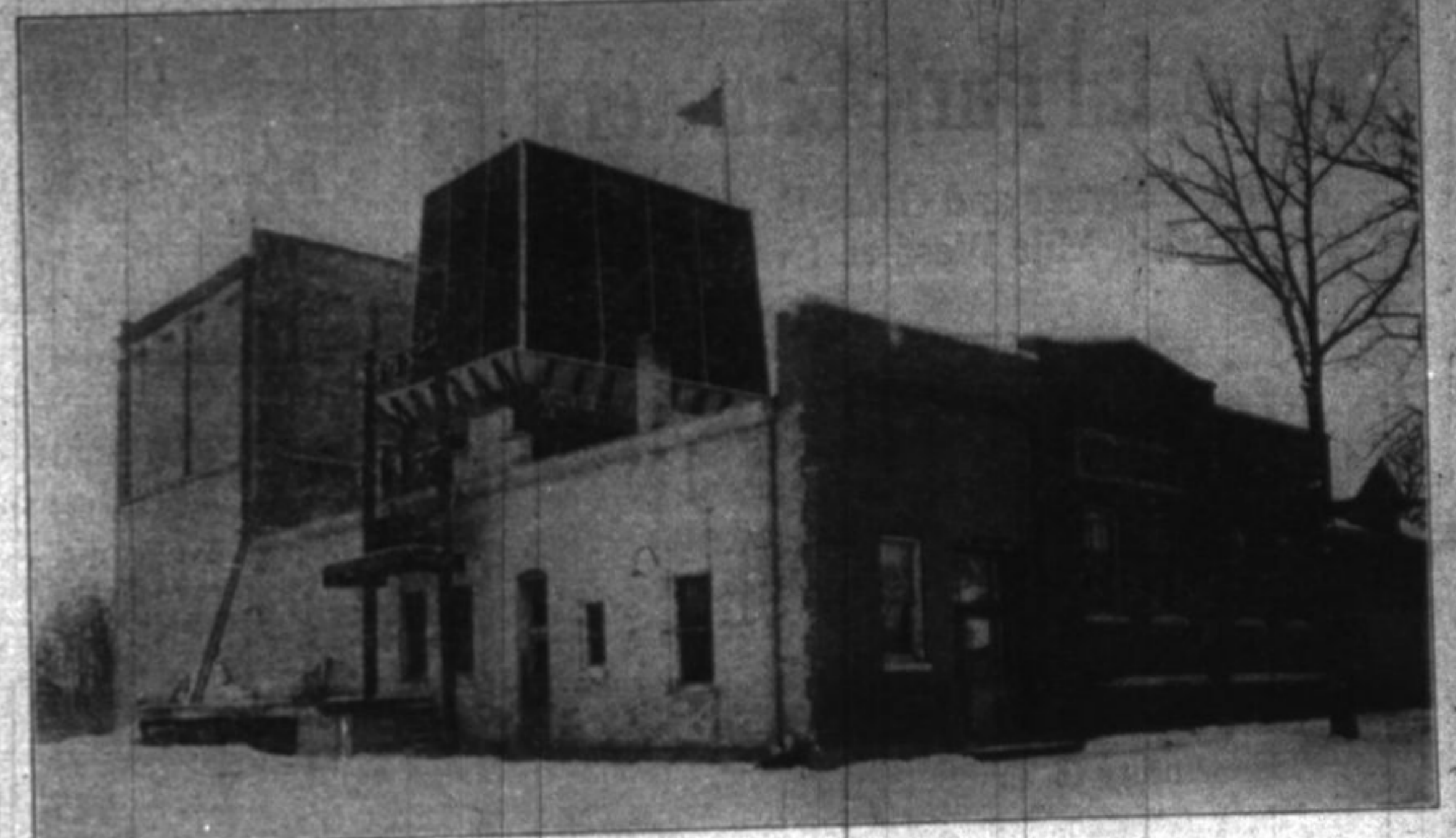
The Evanston Woman's Club has
