Mrs. F. B. Green's resignation having been read and accepted at the last council meeting. Mrs. Bastin was elected to take her place. The mayor asked to be allowed to appoint a special committee to be known as the "Advisory Board" to the hospital executive committee—favor granted—the following names were then read as members of the Advisory Board:

of the value of Ten Thousand Dollars, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, to be turned over by them to a Hospital, if such be established in the City of Highland Park by the first day of January, 1916, and kept by them as a separate fund, to be known as the Marie Hatley McIlvaine Memorial Fund, and used, first to help needy women in child-birth to hospital and other treatment, and further to help other needy women and children in sickness;

AND WHEREAS, said Walter C. Hatley has also delivered to said Trustees the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars, representing interest on said principal sum from July 1, 1915, to January 1, 1916, to be disbursed by the Highland Park Relief and Aid Society, at their discretion, for the same purposes above named;

AND WHEREAS said Walter C. Hatley has also pledged himself to contribute the land or to provide cash to the extent of Three Thousand Dollars to purchase a suitable site for such Hospital, and in addition a sufficient fund to fully furnish a room in said Hospital, including a porch, bathroom and fixtures, to be called the Marie Hatley McIlvaine Memorial Room.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we, the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Highland Park, on behalf of the citizens of our city, hereby extend to Walter C. Hatley, the thanks and appreciation of the citizens of Highland Park, as well as ourselves, for his generous and serviceable gift, and join with him in the wish that it will provide for all time a worthy memorial to his daughter, Marie Hatley McIlvaine, of enduring benefit to the citizens of Highland Park.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be spread on record, and that the City Clerk be instructed to send a copy thereof to Mr. Walter C. Hatley.

Resolution carried.

After the meeting adjourned, the Mayor shook hands with the boys and thanked them for coming.
