"TIM" GOGGINS MEETS DEATH

rying 2,300 volts. Physicians declare that death was instantaneous. The accident took place on the Public Service Company lines about three-quarters of a mile south of Beach. Mr. Goggins had lived in Waukegan all of his life, his home being at the corner of Center and Hickory Streets. Mr. Goggins had been a lineman in the employ of the Public Service Company for the last eight years. He was regarded as one of the most experienced, and at the same time one of the most careful employes of the company. He was well-known along the shore as for the last few years he had been Waukegan's baseball idol. He was a pinch hitter and could always be depended on to "deliver the goods" when needed.

An especially sad feature in connection with the death of Mr. Goggins is that he had been married but little over three months. His marriage to Miss Ethel Sinnott occurred on November 18, last year.

His many friends here will be grieved to learn of his death.

Corporal Miller of Troop B Succumbs. Spanish American War Veterans Took Charge of Body

On Sunday afternoon, the funeral services of Mr. Eugene Miller, a corporal at Fort Sheridan, took place at the War Veterans' Hall in Highwood.

The burial was under the auspices of the Spanish American War Veterans and auxiliary. Mr. Miller was buried with all the military honors possible as he was well liked by all that knew him and was a credit to his company. He was forty years old. The services were most impressive and touched the hearts of most every spectator. After services in the hall the body was taken to St. James church where Father S. J. Gates officiated, the procession going by foot from the hall to the church and from the church to the cemetery at Fort Sheridan where the band and B troop of which he was a member, met them. The horse which the deceased had ridden for so many years and which seemed to be the chief mourner, followed, empty saddled, directly behind the coffin. Nearly all the

camp and auxiliaries in Chicago and vicinity were represented.
