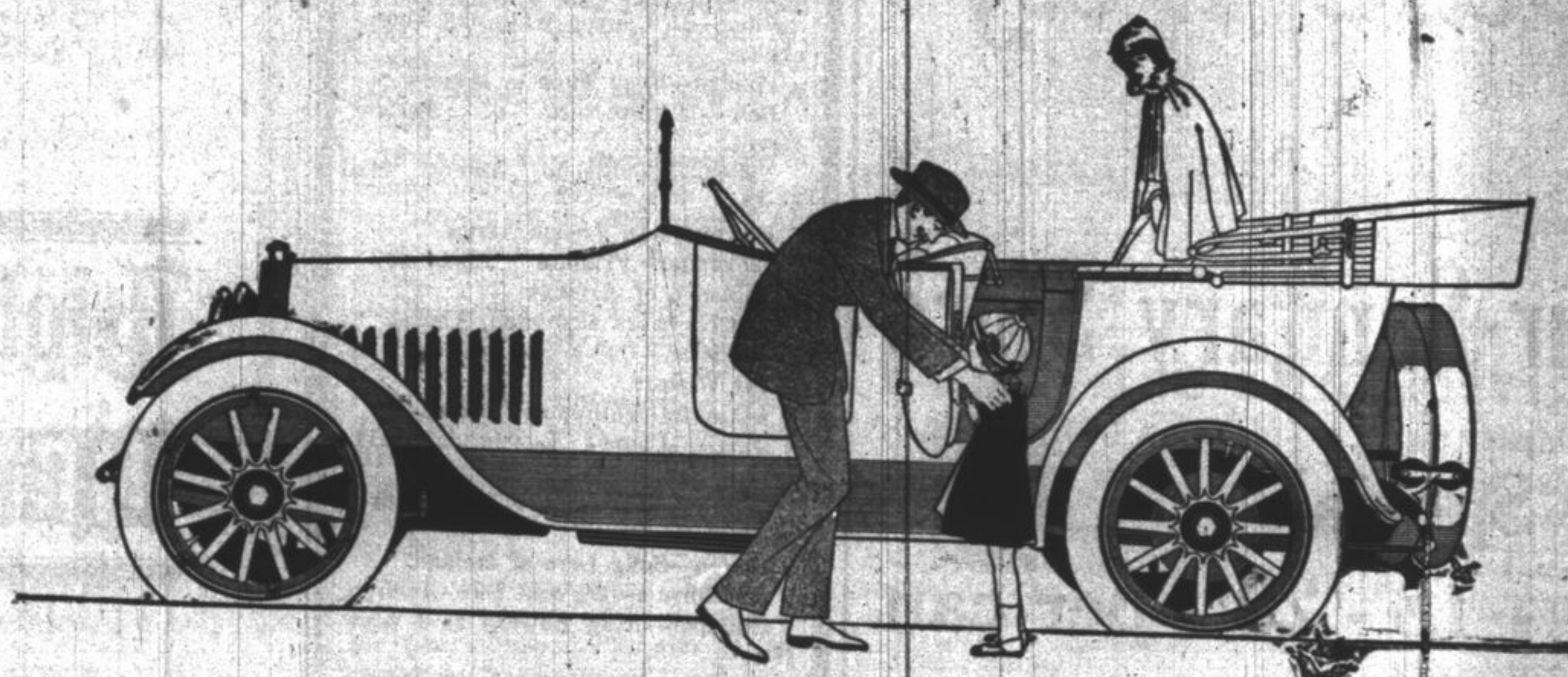

 Notice is hereby given to all persons interested, that the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Deerfield, County of Lake and State of Illinois, having ordered that a 6" internal diameter water supply pipe be laid on the East side of Springfield Avenue from Hazel Avenue to Fair Oaks Avenue in the said Village of Deerfield, County of Lake and State of Illinois, the whole cost of said assessment, to be divided into ten annual installments in accordance with an act of the General Assembly of the State of Illinois, entitled "An Act Concerning Local Improvements, approved June 14, 1897, and all amendments thereto", said installments to draw five per cent (5%) interest per annum according to law, the ordinance for the same being on file in the office of the Village Clerk, having applied to the County Court of Lake County, Docket No. 10, for an assessment of the costs of said improvement according to benefits; and an assessment therefor having been made and returned to said court, a final hearing will be had on the 8th day of April, A.
