CAMELS OF THE DESERT

Their Peculiar Adaptability to Life in

the Sandy Wastes.

The camel thrives only in desert regions. And herein lies its usefulness to man, for by its means alone is he enabled to cross barren tracts otherwise impassable. This ability to live without water and with little food for long periods is due to two natural res ervoirs. Water is stored in special pockets in the lining of the stomach. while a large mass of fat is stored on the back, forming the characteristic hump, though, according to popular be-

lief, it is here that the water is held. Though it will manage to subsist for long periods on the thorny scrub such as forms the only vegetation of desert areas and with very little water, its complacency in these matters may be overtaxed, as was disastrously shown during the first expedition to Khartum.

Two other factors in the adaptability of the camel to a desert life have to be taken into account. These are the feet and nostrils. The first named have but two toes, protected by very thick. horny pads to resist the burning sand. while the nostrils are long and slitlike and can be closed at will, thereby enabling the animal to survive the awful sandstorms which so frequently endanger the lives of travelers in these inhospitable regions.-St. Paul Ploneer
