AN ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARY OF CITY OFFICERS AND CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, ILL.

Be It Ordained by the Council of the City of Highland Park:

Section 1.—That the salaries of the following City Officers and Employees for the fiscal year beginning May 1st, 1916 and ending April 30th, 1917, be fixed at such sum as is provided for by this ordinance for such officer or employe, for the discharge of the duties of such office as required under the laws of the State of Illinois, and the ordinances of the City of Highland Park during the term of his office or employment, and that such officer or employe shall receive no further compensation from the City of Highland Park for the duties of such office during the term thereof.

That the salary of the Mayor be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Two Hundred Fifty (\$250.00) Dollars per annum.

That the salary of each of the Commissioners be and it is hereby fixed at the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per annum.

That the salary of the City Clerk be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Twenty-one Hundred Dollars (\$2100.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Corporation Counsel be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Eighteen Hundred Dollars (\$1800.00) per annum.

That the salary of the City Treasurer be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) per annum.

That the salary of the City Collector be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars (\$1200.00) per annum.

That the salary of the City Marshal be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Eleven Hundred Dollars (\$1100.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Assistant City Marshal be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) per annum.

That the salary of each of the Police Officers (except such policemen as are appointed for special duty and for a limited term, less than a year) be and it is hereby fixed at the sum of Four Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$450.00) for the first six months and Four Hundred and Seventy-five (\$475.00) Dollars for the balance of the fiscal year.

That the salary of the Water Works Engineer be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Thirteen Hundred Dollars (\$1300.00) per annum.

That the salary of the first and second Assistant Engineers at the Water Works be and it is hereby fixed at the sum of Nine Hundred and Sixty Dollars (\$960.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Helper at the Water Works be and it is hereby fixed at the sum of Nine Hundred Dollars (\$900.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Foreman of Public Works be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand, Sixty Dollars (\$1060.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Foreman of Sewer and Water Mains be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand, Sixty Dollars (\$1060.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Sanitary and Water Meter Inspector be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Assistant to the City Clerk be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Assistant City Treasurer be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Stenographer in the City Clerk's Office be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Seven Hundred and Eighty Dollars (\$780.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Time Keeper be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Seven Hundred and Eighty Dollars (\$780.00) per annum.

That the salary of the City Fireman in charge of the Fire Station (during the day) be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Seven Hundred and Eighty (\$780.00) Dollars per annum.

That the salary of the City Fireman in charge of the Fire Station (during the night) be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Seven Hundred and Eighty (\$780.00) Dollars per annum.

That the salary of the Fire Marshal, Assistant Fire Marshal and Firemen be and it is hereby fixed at the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) for the first hour of attendance at each fire and Seventy-five Cents (\$0.75) per hour of actual service rendered for each hour thereafter.

Section 2.—That the salaries provided for in Section One of this ordinance shall be due and payable in semi-monthly installments on the First and Fifteenth day of each month for the preceding half month of their services during their term of office.

Section 3.—That the salary of the Mayor, Commissioners, City Clerk, Corporation Counsel, City Marshal, Assistant City Marshal, City Police Officers and Stenographer shall be paid from the Salary of Officers' Fund provided for in the Department of Public Affairs.

That the salary of the City Treasurer, Assistant City Treasurer, Assistant to the City Clerk, City Collector and Time Keeper shall be paid from the salary of Officers' Fund provided for in the Department of Accounts and Finance.

That the salary of the Foreman of Sewer and Water Mains, Engineer at the Water Works, First and Second Assistant Engineers at the Water Works, Helper at the Water Works, Sanitary and Water Meter Inspector and Day and Night Firemen at the Fire Station shall be paid from the Salary Fund provided for in the Department of Public Health and Safety.

That the salary of the Foreman of Public Works shall be paid from the Salary Fund provided for in the Department of Streets and Public Improvements.

Section 4.—That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5.—This ordinance is declared to be urgent and necessary for the immediate preservation of the Public Health and Safety and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER TWENTY (20) OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, ENTITLED WATER DEPT.

Be It Ordained by the Council of the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois:

Section 1.—That Chapter Twenty (20) entitled Water Department, of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Highland Park, as printed and published by authority of the City Council of the City of Highland Park, pursuant to ordinance passed May 2nd, 1911, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following sections, to wit:

11.—Water rents shall be due and payable upon the first day of November, the first day of April, and the first day of August in each year, and shall be payable in advance, except where meters are used, in which case payments shall be made as above, fixed upon the readings of the meters for the preceding period.

180.—The rate provided for in Section One Hundred and Seventy-nine (179) shall not apply to cases where meters are used. Where meters are used a charge of twelve cents (12c.) net per hundred cubic feet will be made for all water used, except in cases where water takers shall contract with the City prior to April 1st of any one year to use a minimum amount of One Hundred and Thirty-four Thousand (134,000) cubic feet of water during the fiscal year suc-
