On Tuesday, the eighth grades of both Lincoln and Ravinia schools visited the High School and were most favorably impressed.

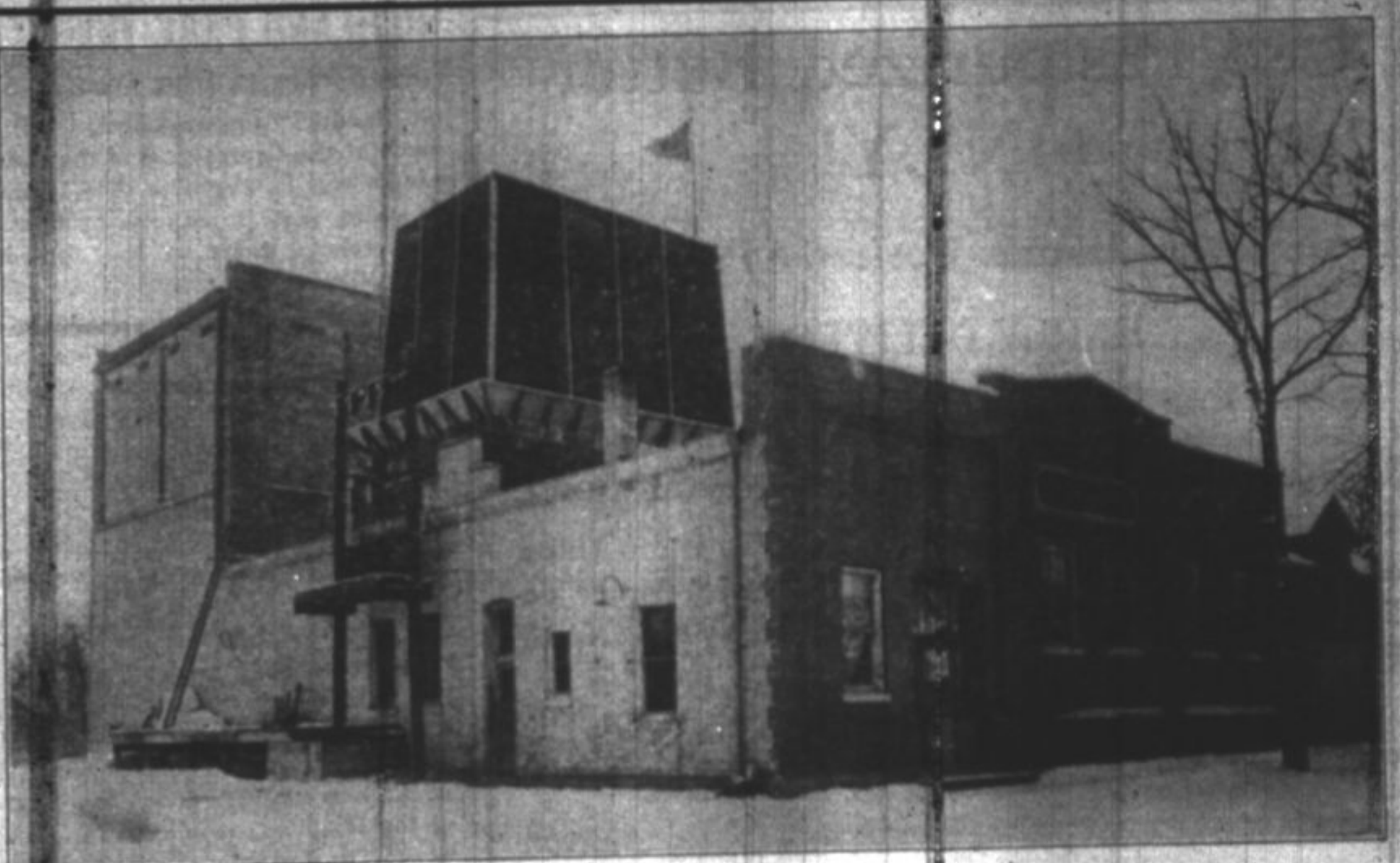
The annual school picnic will take place next Thursday at Ravinia Park. Ridge, Lincoln and Ravinia schools will all be present.

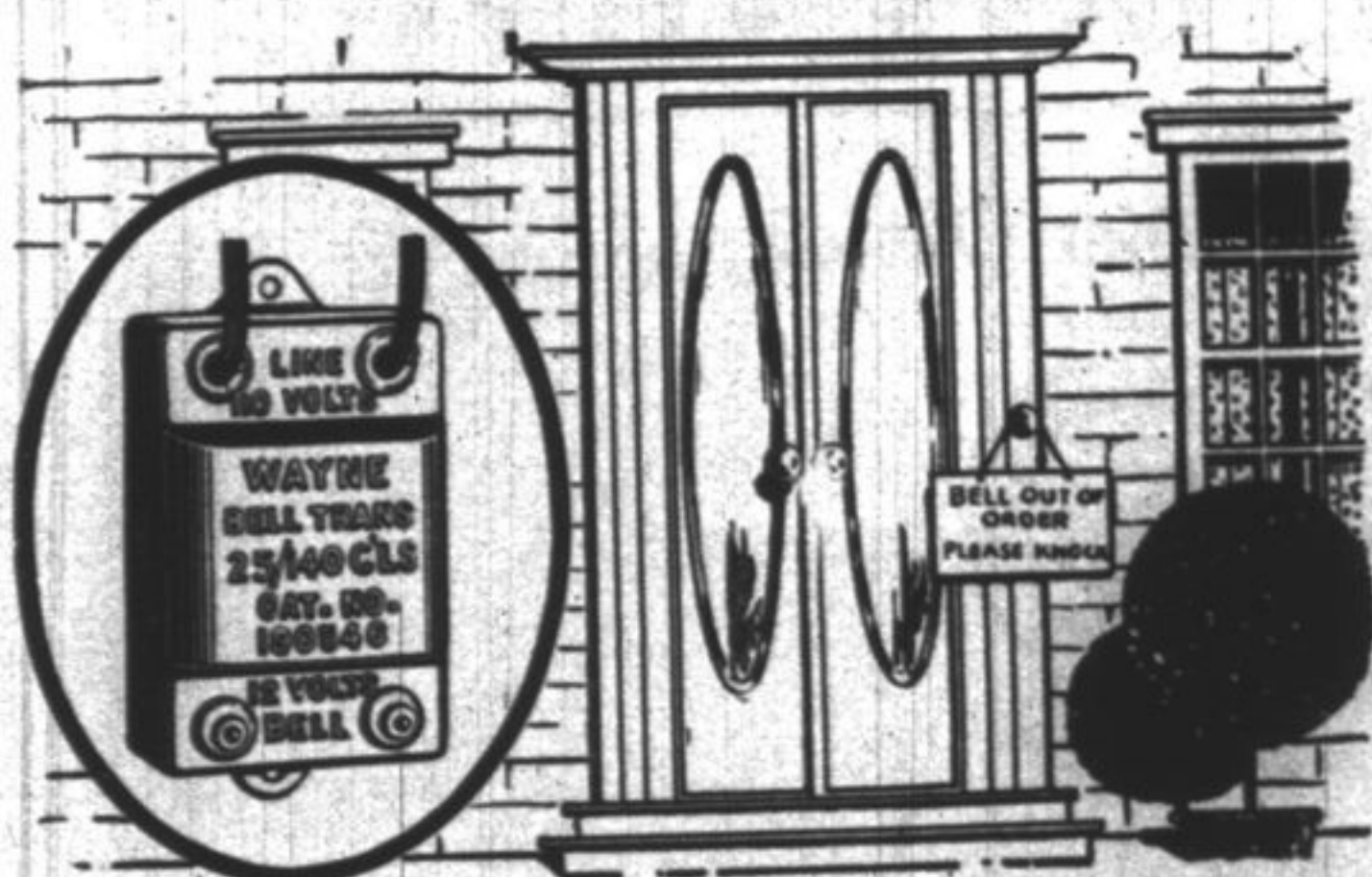

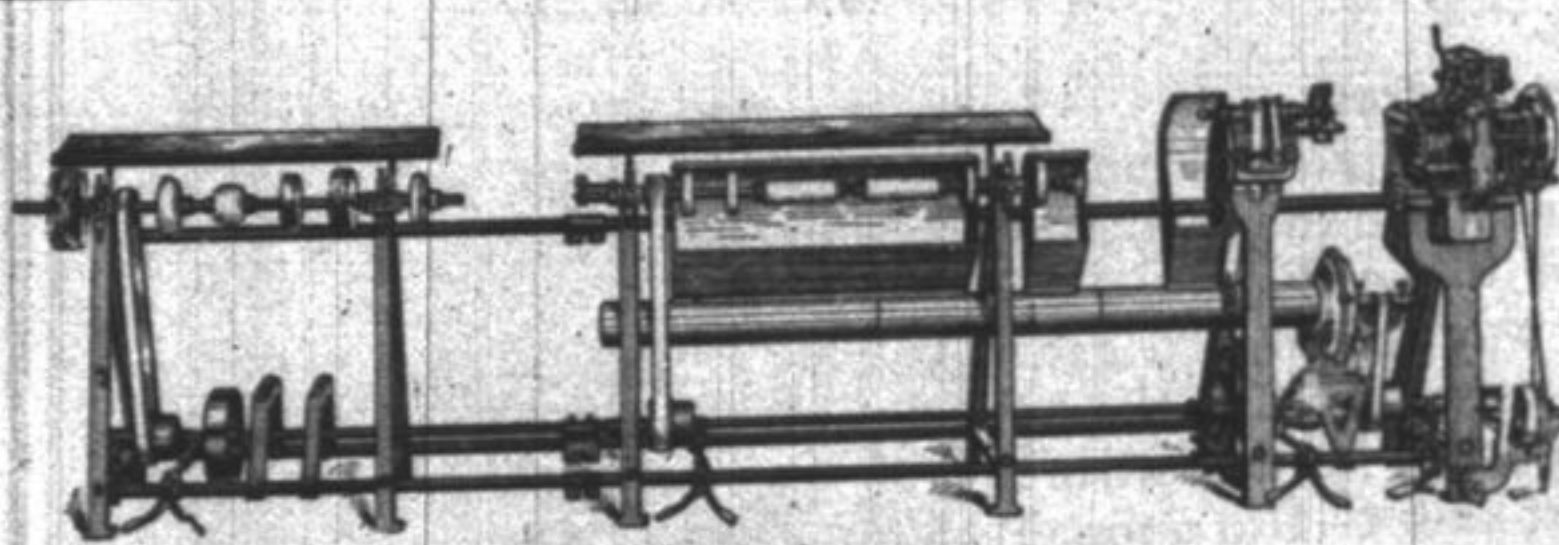
