HIGHLAND PARK HOSPITAL

on Sunday announcement will be made of the Campaign and the church people will be urged to give liberally in order that it may be brought to a successful issue on the appointed day, Monday, June 12th.

Several large subscriptions are already in the hands of the committee, and the most pleasing part about it is that many of these have come without solicitation, being sent to Mayor Hastings or the Campaign Committee at No. 8 Sheridan Block even before the subscription was asked for. One gift of \$100 came from a former Highland Park resident now in Alabama. Another gift of \$500 was given to the committee without any solicitation and in fact without any mention having been made of the Hospital work. The Highland Park L. A. R. has subscribed for two shares of the Hospital stock as an organization. The Knights of Columbus have volunteered to furnish and name a room in the new building.

At Monday night's meeting Mayor Hastings announced the appointment of the following Site Committee: J. P. Smith, Curtis N. Kimball and W. H. Baldwin. All the sites so far suggested by Highland Park residents will be turned over to this committee and any new sites that may be offered can be sent direct to Mr. Smith or either of the other two members of this committee.

It may again be stated that Highland Park Hospital is a non-dividend paying corporation organized for the purpose of ministering to the sick, both poor and rich. Stock sells at \$10 a share and each share of stock gives the holder a vote in the management of the Hospital. If it ever should become necessary to liquidate the payments of the Hospital, whatever property then existed would be disposed of and the proceeds divided between the stockholders of the association.

Too much cannot be said of the need of this institution; and each day this need seems to grow more apparent.

It may again be stated that the Hospital will be absolutely non-sectarian, that it will be perfectly equipped, that it will be open at all hours of the day and night to rich and poor, that it will not be a money making institution, that it will care for medical, surgical and maternity cases, that it will be open to all reputable physicians, that it will exist for one purpose only to minister to the sufferer, and that it will therefore be erected by all the residents of Highland Park for all the residents of Highland Park.

Mayor Hastings expresses his very great gratification at the splendid cooperation that is being shown by citizens in every walk of life in this movement. "Every organization and every association has come together on a common stamping ground with the citizens of this community in response to the call I have sent out as general chairman. I am absolutely confident of success in this movement, and I am more grateful to you all for the fine response you are giving to this call than you can possibly know. We are 7,000 now. In a very few years we will be 14,000. We need the Hospital for our 7,000 and we will need it twice as much for our 14,000; but if we should build the Hospital and never have to care for a patient in it we would still be accomplishing a wonderful thing, and there isn't one of us but would be thankful. If you will all stand with the Executive Committee of this Hospital and for the next four days work hand in hand with us in this great common cause we can more than reach the goal; and I know the public spirit of Highland Park too well to think that there is even a possibility of failure. We will get our \$60,000 and we will have it in the "strong box" by next Monday night. I am depending upon every man, every woman and every child in Highland Park to lend a hand. If we do not reach you in time don't hesitate to send your contribution or your pledge to the Campaign Committee at No. 8 Sheridan Block. We will send your button by return mail.

The Highland Park boys' band will add to the general enthusiasm by giving an hour's band concert in front of Deerfield-Shields High School this evening. This band of musicians volunteers its services in the hope of aiding the Hospital cause by arousing added interest among the residents of Highland Park.

Under the chairmanship of Dr. Johnston Davis, Deerfield has a separate organization of campaigners who are systematically covering every house in their town. A similar organization has been perfected under the leadership of Dr. R. B. Jacks in Highwood. Reports from Deerfield and Highwood will be made at each evening's dinner of the campaign workers.

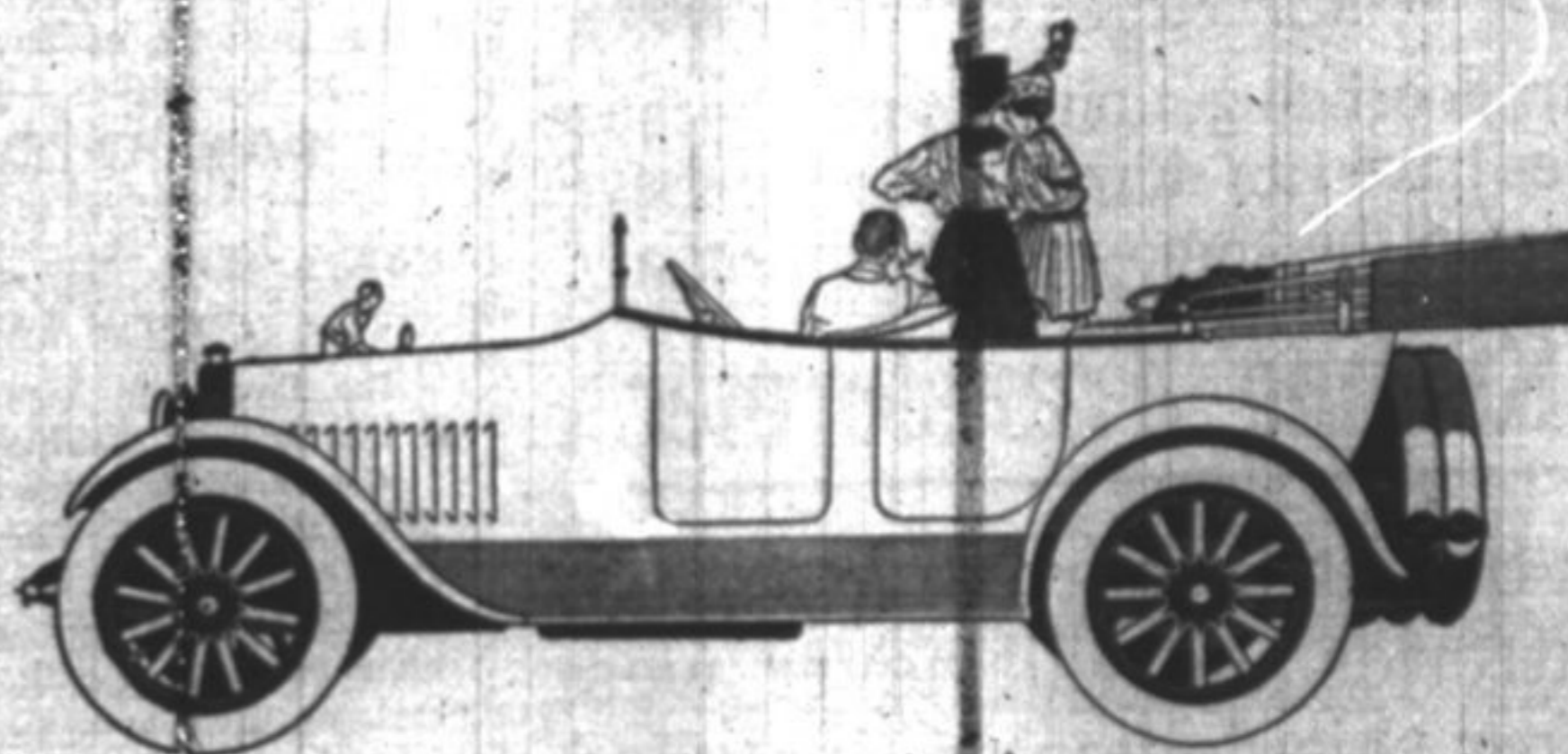
