MRS. GEORGIANA E. McBEAN DIES

George B. and Archibald J. F. Me-Bean died Saturday morning at her residence, 505 Hazel avenue after an illness of several weeks.

She was the daughter of George Barnet, who came from Scotland to Canada in 1830 and settled in Illinois near Lockport in the early forties and was at the time of his death president of the Joliet and Chicago R. R. now the Chicago and Alton.

Mrs. McBean was born at St. Catherines, Canada, and was one of a family of thirteen children of whom only a brother and sister survive her. In 1886 she married Archibald J. Mc-Bean, who died in 1908 and had spent nearly all her married life in Chicago. She was one of the oldest Amateur Musical.
