FOR SALE The Christian church, at Rochester, which for forty years was a landmark of that section of Sangamon county, was struck by lightning and destroyed by fire. J. W. Lands of Grayson, a town near Harrisburg, was arrested upon a warrant sworn out by his wife, charging him with an attempted attack upon his stepdaughter. With deaths increased to fifteen and with seventy-five advanced cases of typhoid fever reported, the epidemic in its grip for the last six weeks, seems to be under control at Tuscola. J., recovering from a mangled foot, injured while fighting with the American legion in the trenches of northern France. Great damage to the corn as a result of drought is reported throughout Illinois, Wisconsin and Iowa. S. E. Bradt, De Kalb banker, has just made a tour of 300 miles in the best corn section of the three states named, and says he saw evidence of permanent damage. Extra police were sworn in, suspicious characters rounded up, box cars searched, and a general watch set by citizens, themselves in an effort to stop the wave of crime which swept over Peoria.
