sentenced to serve 70 days in the county jail.

Otto Wallin--Fined \$1,100 and sentenced to serve 30 days in the county jail.

George Cesar--Fined \$600 and sentenced to serve 70 days in the county jail.

Michael McGuire--Fined \$350 and sentenced to serve 40 days in the county jail.

Thomas McCann fined \$250 and sentenced to serve 30 days in the county jail.

The total amount of the fines assessed was \$5,300. The total length of time the men were sentenced to remain in jail was 290 days. In addition to the foregoing sentences the court ordered the sheriff to close up the place of business of each of the defendants until they furnish a bond of \$1,000 each assuring the court that there will be no further violation of the law in their places. It is provided further that in case any of the defendants neglect to pay their fines that they shall work these fines out on the road at the rate of \$1.50 per day.

Mrs. Charles Putnam, wife of the superintendent of the American Steel and Wire Company plant at Waukegan, met almost instant death Sunday evening about 8 o'clock at Downey's crossing at the south boundary of the Naval Training Station when a Chicago & Milwaukee Electric Limited train struck an auto in which she was riding.

Her husband, the superintendent, and Harry H. Beach, driver of the auto, and owner of the Beach garage, met injuries as follows:

Mr. Putnam--Bad cut on leg; bad cut on head; badly bruised side.

Mr. Beach--Bad cut on forehead and hand.

The accident was due to failure of any of the party to note the limited train which, like they, was going south and which at that point had just emerged from the subway coming from the North Chicago junction.

FANNY WILLIAMS LAKE VICTIM

Fatality Occurred Wednesday August Ninth Near Moraine Beach. Efforts to Resuscitate Futile

Fannie Williams, daughter of the chief of police of Highwood, is the latest victim of grim Lake Michigan. The young woman, 18 years old, was drowned Wednesday evening when the undertow proved too strong for her powers.

She was dragged to her death while others near at hand looked on and though they attempted to rescue her in time, were unable to do so. She, with her sister, Mrs. Henry Berberick, Mr. Berberick and John David were in swimming together when the fatality occurred.

Miss Williams, who is considered a good swimmer, ventured out too far and when her shouts for help were given, they came too late. All who could swim lent their aid to the search, and fifteen minutes after she disappeared, the body was recovered by Mr. John Lowther.

Lung motor was used, but in vain. All efforts to resuscitate were made, but they proved fruitless.

Coroner J. L. Taylor held an inquest at the home of the chief of police Thursday morning, at which it developed that there have been several close calls at the same spot where Miss Williams drowned and effort will be made to keep the bathers from frequenting that part of the shore.

Funeral services were read by Father Gates at the St. James church, Highwood, Saturday morning at ten o'clock, followed by burial in Wilmette.

Root and two sons, Harold A. and Gus, and a daughter, Mrs. Sadie Hapton.
