Washington St., Chicago, where all supplies may be brought at any time. Each week the articles finished in Highland Park, are taken to this shop and from there are taken as quickly as possible to wherever they are most needed in France.

Women all over the United States are helping in this great work and the gratitude of the French soldiers and the nation in general is warmly expressed in the letters which come to the shop.
