Mrs. George Karch and Miss Jennie Karch were guests of Mrs. William Cody of Chicago, Thursday.

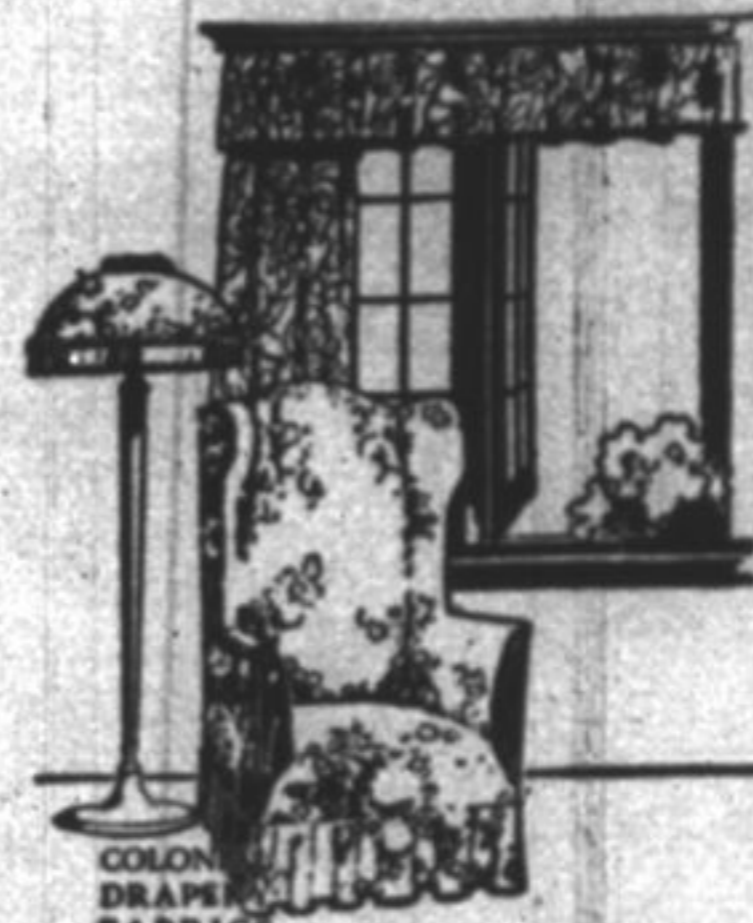

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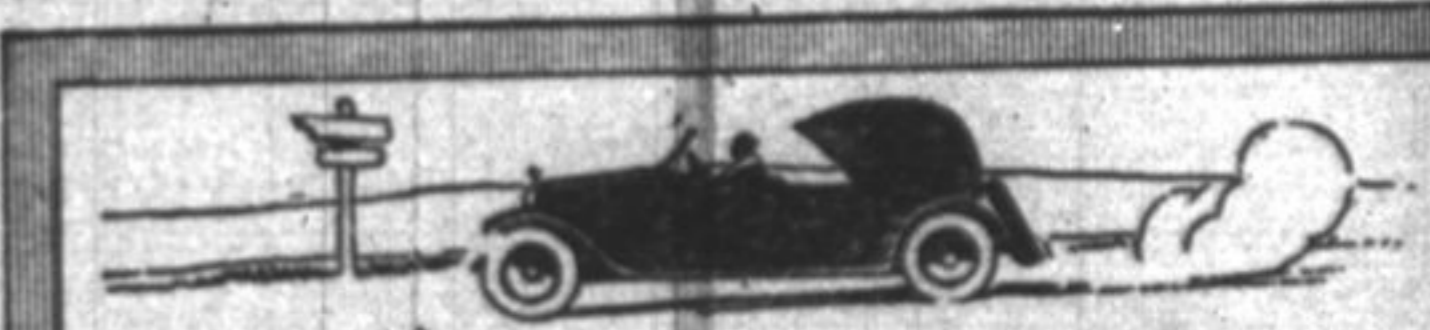
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
