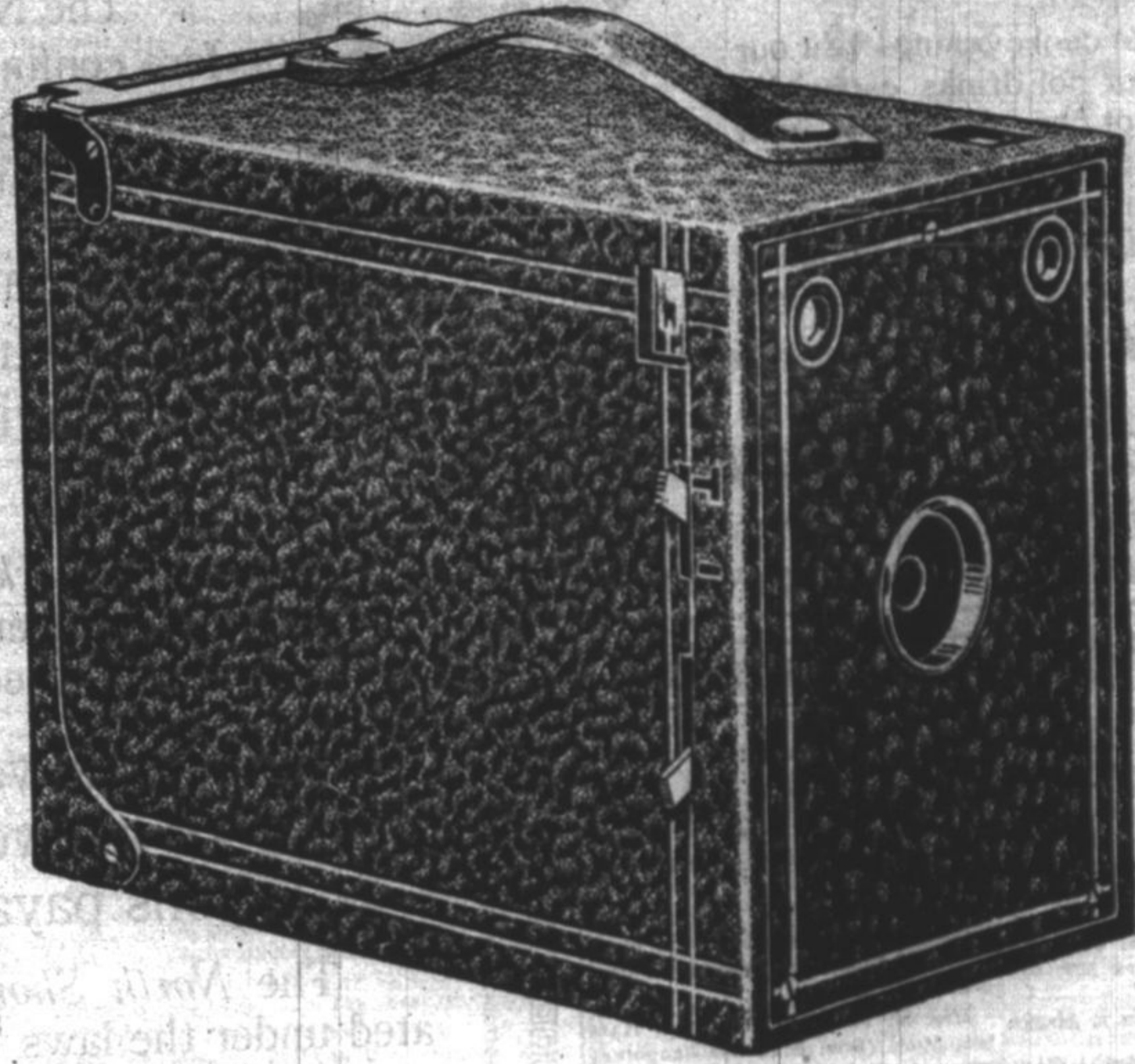
Baptist Church Notes
