Those who live in the east and north nificence of distances in Texas. Here are just a few figures that will help to Lone Star State

The distance from Houston to El Paso by the nearest rail route is 833 miles, which is only 114 miles less than the distance from New York to Chicago, 947 miles,

It is 820 miles by rail from San Antonio to El Paso. This is 114 miles greater than the distance from Chicago to Pittsburgh.

The distance from Echo, Tex., the most eastern point on a direct railroad route, to El Paso, is 944 miles, or three miles less than the distance from New York to Chicago,

The distance from Brownsville, Tex. on the gulf coast, the easternmost point on the Texas-Mexican border, to El Paso, the western terminus of the border, is more than 1.200 miles. This is greater than the distance from Nam York city to Tampa, Fla., or to Spring field, Ill. It is greater than the distance from New York to St. Louis by 140 miles.-Philadelphia Ledger
