NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that bids will be received for the construction of a six inch (6") cast iron water main in and along the westerly side of First Street, beginning at and connecting with the end of the present water main in First Street, located at the intersection of the south line of Laurel Avenue, with a line eighteen feet (18') easterly of the west line of First Street, thence northerly parallel with and eighteen feet (18') easterly of and from the westerly line of said First street, a distance of five hundred feet (500') to and connecting with the existing water main now existing in Central Avenue, all in the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois, as a whole in accordance with the ordinance thereof. Said bids will be opened on the 4th day of January, A. D. 1917, at the hour of 5:30 o'clock p. m. at the office of the Board of Local Improvements in the City Hall of the City of Highland Park.

The specifications and blank proposals will be furnished at the office of the Board of Local Improvements in the City Hall in said city.

The contractor will be paid in bonds, which bonds will draw interest at the rate of (5) per cent, per annum.

All proposals or bids must be accompanied by a certified check payable to the President of the Board of Local Improvements of the City of Highland Park for the sum of not less than ten (10) per cent of the aggregate of the proposal.

Said proposal must be delivered to the President of the Board of Local Improvements in open session of said Board at the time and place fixed herein for the opening of the same.

No proposal or bid will be considered unless accompanied by check as herein provided.

The Board of Local Improvements reserves the right to reject any or all bids if they deem it best for the public good.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENT NOTICE NO.

221

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that the City Council of the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois having ordered the local improvement of the roadways of Cedar Avenue, from a point thirty (30) feet west of the center line of St. Johns Avenue easterly to the paved roadway in Sheridan Road exclusive of the roadway across Wade Street; St. Johns Avenue from the southerly line of Beech Street extended southerly to the paved roadway provided for in Cedar Avenue; Linden Avenue from the southerly line of Beech Street extended southerly to the paved roadway provided for in Cedar Avenue; Lincoln Avenue from the southerly line of Beech Street extended southerly to the paved roadway provided for in Cedar Avenue, by grading, draining, curbing, paving with a concrete pavement having a bituminous concrete surface and otherwise improving, and the construction of a reinforced concrete bridge located over the ravine in Cedar Avenue; the ordinance for same being on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City and having applied to the County Court of Lake County for an assessment of the costs of said improvement according to benefits, and an assessment thereof having been made and returned to said court, the final hearing thereon will be had on the Sixth day of January A. D. 1917, or as soon thereafter as the business of the court will permit.

Said assessments is payable in ten installments, with interest at the rate of five (5) per centum per annum on all installments from and after date of issue of first voucher. All persons desiring may file objections in said court before said day and may appear on the hearing and make their defense.

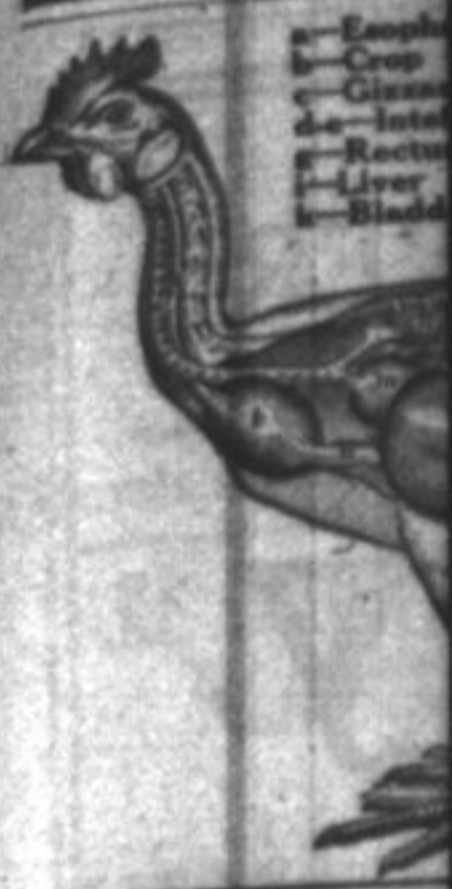
