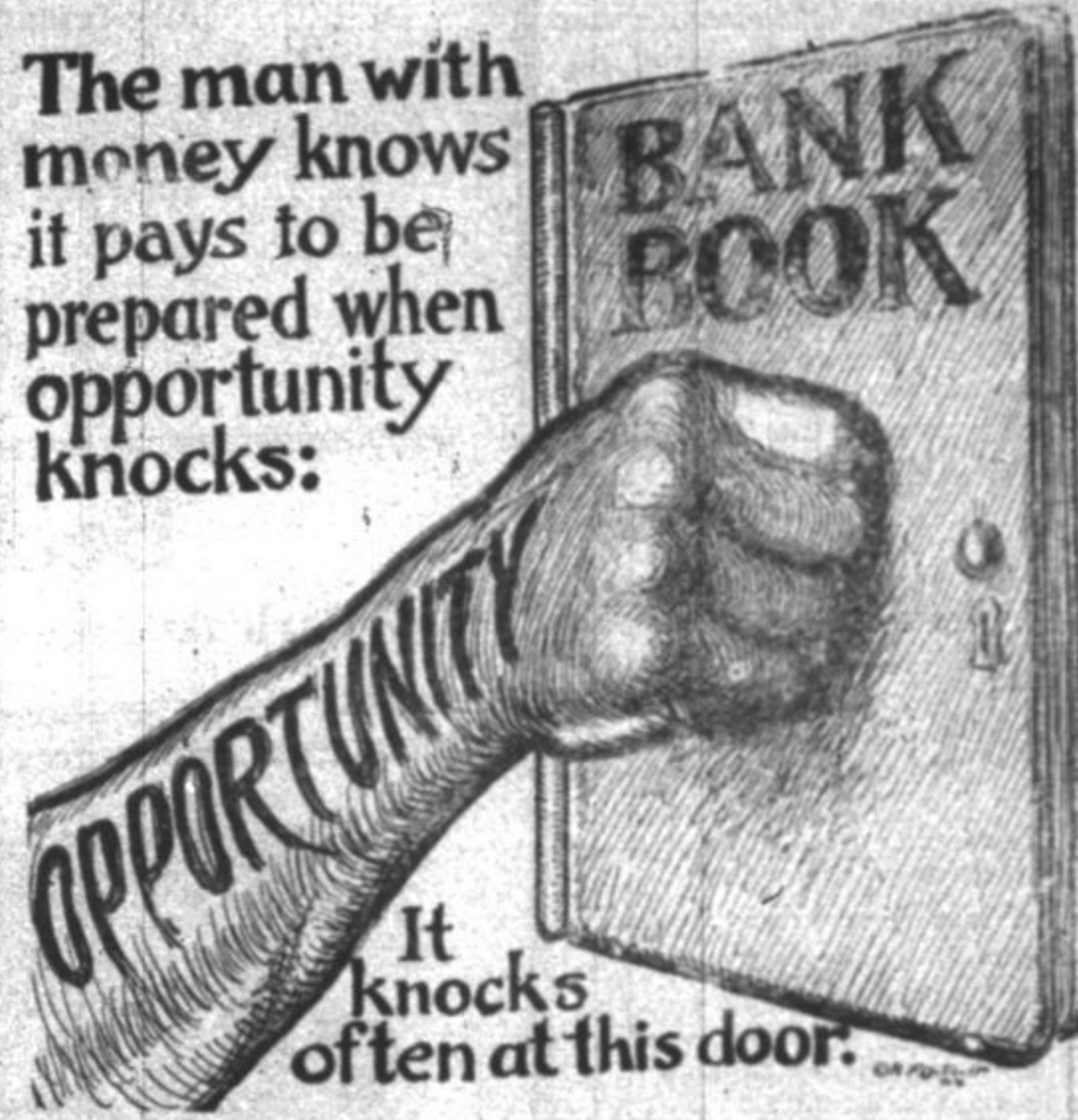

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that the City Council of the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois, having ordered the grading, removing surplus excavated materials, draining, curbing, sweeping, spiking, scarifying, flushing, rolling, sodding and seeding; adjusting concrete walk approaches, adjusting and repairing catch basins; furnishing and setting new inlet tops, furnishing and placing cinders, furnishing and setting galvanized iron curb edging, furnishing and constructing cast iron gutter plates with concrete supports, constructing new concrete walk approaches, new brick masonry catch basins, new brick masonry inlets, macadam foundation of crushed limestone with a limestone screening binder, new concrete foundation, new bituminous macadam pavement for connections, new vitrified block pavement with grout filler and bitumin-
