

MRS. RICHARD J. STREET FORMER RESIDENT DIES

Few Weeks Illness Causes Death in Coronado, California on February Fourth

The older residents of Highland Park were saddened when they heard on Monday of the sudden death of Mrs. Richard J. Street, which occurred at her home in Coronado, California, on Sunday night, February fourth.

Mrs. Street spent a considerable part of the autumn in Chicago with her daughter, Mrs. T. C. MacCauley and frequently visited her Highland Park friends and relatives. She only returned to California after Christmas, when it was known that she had an incurable disease and that her days were numbered; the end, however, came sooner than was anticipated, and it is a consolation to know that she was spared much of the suffering which would have been inevitable had she lived longer.

Mr. and Mrs. Street lived in Highland Park for forty years and were prominently identified with the social life of the community during all that period. Their home was a center of open hearted hospitality and Mrs. Street was universally beloved by all who knew her.

Seven years ago upon Mr. Street's retirement from the First National Bank of Chicago, with which during his whole business life he was identified, they went to California and made their home in Coronado. Though they were very happy there they missed their old Highland Park friends, but they had the satisfaction

of being near Mr. Street's sisters, Mrs. George D. Boulton and Miss Jade Street.

Mrs. Street like her husband, was born in Canada, and her maiden name was Emeline Caroline Hamilton, she is survived by her husband and her three children, Dr. Richard Hamilton Street of Chicago, Mr. Gerald B. Street of Wilmington, Delaware, and Mrs. T. C. MacCauley, who at present is in Memphis, Tennessee.

Funeral services were held in Christ Church, Coronado on Wednesday, February seventh.

It is understood to be Mr. Street's purpose to bring Mrs. Street's body to Highland Park, in the spring and to inter it in the family plot in the Lake Forest cemetery.

The sympathy of all their many friends goes out to Mr. Street and the surviving members of his family in their great bereavement.

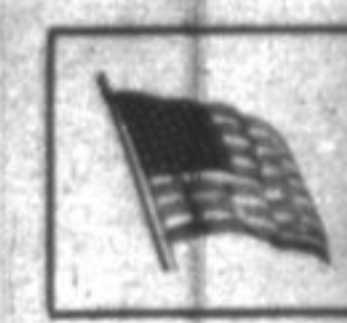
