

The two men were taking a walk, starting from their home shortly after the noon meal. When they reached the raiload crossing their way was blocked by a moving northbound FOR C. N. S. & M. train. As the last car passed they started across. Both stepped in front of a fast moving southbound train.

Larsen was thrown from the right of way by the force of the collision a few feet south of where he was struck, but Peterson was carried about twenty-five feet. The latter was lifeless when found by the members of the train crew and others who ran to his assistance

An examination of the remains of Peterson proved that he had sustained a fractured skull and other terrible injuries. The inquest was held over the remains Monday morning and a verdict of accidental death returned by the jury.

Both of the men are married. Larsen has several small children.
