Annual Town Meeting and Election

Notice is hereby given to the legal voters, residents of the township of Deerfield, County of Lake, Illinois, that the annual township meeting and election of officers of said township will take place Tuesday the third day of April proximo, being the first Tuesday in said month.

The election will begin at the hour of 7 a. m. and close at 5 p. m. in the places designated as follows: First precinct, office of Jas. H. Duffy, corner E. Central Avenue and Sheridan Road, Highland Park, Ill.; Second precinct, City Hall, Highwood, Ill.; Third precinct, Fire Station Building, W.
