AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF BATHING BEACHES.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Highland Park:

SECTION 1. No person shall swim or bathe in the waters of Lake Michigan adjacent to the City of Highland Park, unless clad in a suitable bathing suit.

SECTION 2. No person desiring to bathe or swim in the waters of Lake Michigan adjacent to the City of Highland Park, shall undress in any place in said city other than in an enclosed building, house or bathing house.

SECTION 3. No person shall loiter upon any street or in any park or public place in the City of Highland Park while clad in a bathing suit.

SECTION 4. No person shall be or appear on any street nor in any park or public place of the City of Highland Park while wearing a bathing suit unless such person wears also an outer garment reaching from the shoulders to the knees.

SECTION 5. No person shall be permitted to make use of any bathing house erected or to be erected upon the beach of Lake Michigan within the limits of the City of Highland Park unless such person shall have obtained the permit herein authorized to be issued for the use of such bathing house, which permit shall be presented to the officer or other person in charge of said bathing house, whenever entrance thereto is requested, PROVIDED that nothing in this Section contained shall be applicable to the use of any bathing house or bathing houses already erected or hereafter erected upon private property for private use by the owners thereof.

The City Clerk is authorized to issue permits for the use of such bathing house, upon the following terms, and not otherwise:

No permit shall be issued excepting upon a written application therefor signed by the applicant and endorsed by two (2) resident property owners of the City of Highland Park.

A permit for one person shall be issued upon the payment of an annual fee of twenty-five cents (25c) but children under the age of fourteen years may obtain permits without the payment of any fee.

In addition to the annual fee above mentioned each holder of a permit shall pay a fee of Ten Cents (10c) whenever he or she makes use of the lockers in said bathing house or a fee of One Dollar and Fifty (1.50) a month for the use of one locker in said bathing house provided, however, that nothing in this section contained shall be construed as prohibiting the use by the holder of the permit herein provided for of balance of said bathing house for dressing and undressing without charge.

All permits shall be numbered and shall be non-transferable and shall bear upon their face the name and street address of the holder and the City Clerk shall keep a record of all permits issued.

All moneys realized from the issuance of permits shall be used exclusively for the upkeep, maintenance and repair of such bathing house and other equipment erected upon or used in connection with the bathing beach.

No person shall use such bathing house for any other purpose than dressing and undressing therein, as contemplated in this ordinance.

No person shall commit any nuisance in such bathing house.

Every person making use of such bathing house shall behave in an orderly manner and so as not to interfere with the use thereof by any other person.

The license herein authorized may be revoked by the Mayor in the case of any person who shall be convicted of a violation of this ordinance.

SECTION 6. No person shall bathe or swim in the waters of Lake Michigan adjacent to the City of Highland Park between the hours of 10:30 p. m. and 5:00 a. m.

SECTION 7. No loud talking, singing, blowing upon horns, playing of musical instruments or the making of any other noise, which may disturb the peace and quiet shall be permitted upon any bathing beach, street or public place or in any public park within the City of Highland Park after ten thirty p. m. and before six a. m., provided that nothing in this paragraph contained shall be considered to be applicable to any public gathering, authorized or licensed by the proper authorities of the City.

SECTION 8. Whenever by reason of epidemics, plagues or other conditions affecting the public health, the Board of Health shall deem it advisable to prohibit general bathing in the waters of Lake Michigan adjacent to any public beach in the City of Highland Park, then the Mayor is hereby authorized to suspend temporarily and by proclamation, the use of said waters for bathing purposes and to enforce the suspension thereof by such measures as may be appropriate.

SECTION 9. Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not less

than one dollar (\$1.00) and not more than five dollars (\$5.00) for each such violation.

SECTION 10. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.

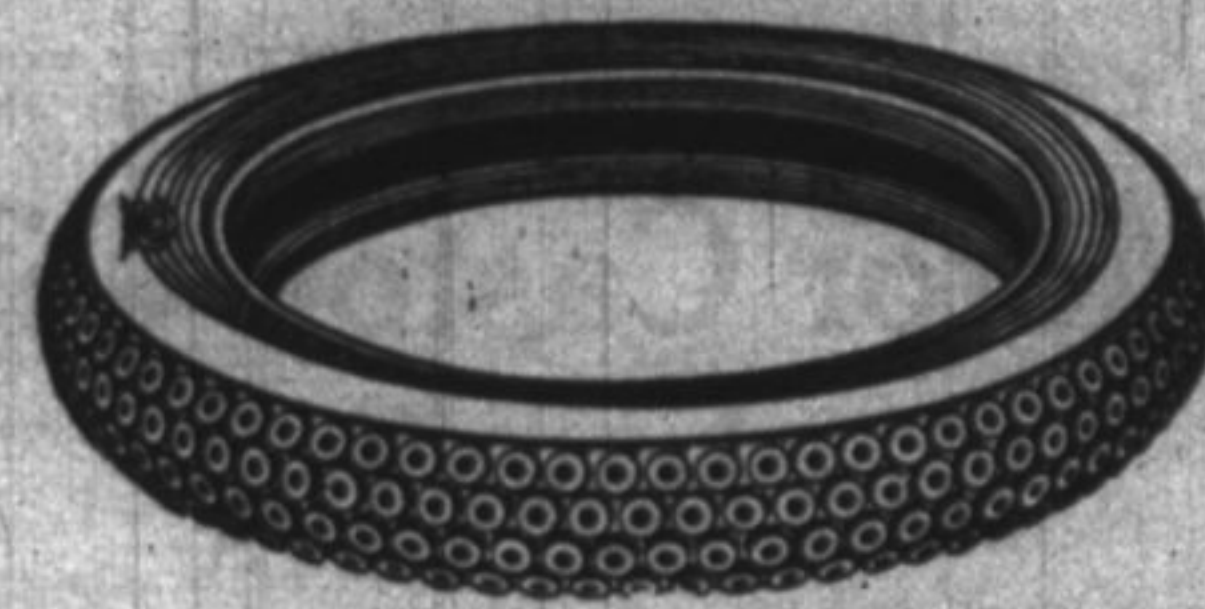
